HAZZAN'S NOTES



This month we now prepare and begin to celebrate our High Holyday season for 5780.

On Saturday, September 21, we begin the High Holyday season in earnest with a wonderful dessert reception in the foyer of the Meeting House (sanctuary) at First Friends beginning at 6:30 pm which will be followed by the stirring and haunting choral Selihot service with our own Beth Shalom Selihot booklets in

the Meeting House (sanctuary) beginning at 7:30 pm. The Beth Shalom Singers (our choir) and I will bring to life the beauty of this liturgy in preparation for the entire High Holyday season. Mark Peterson, our amazing accompanist and choir director, will play the Harris pipe organ and conduct. This will be a special service this year and you will want to make sure to put it on your calendars as a "DO NOT MISS" event! Rosh Hashanah will commence on Sunday night, September 29 with Erev Rosh Hashanah services in the Meeting House beginning at 7:30 pm followed by a Gala Holiday Oneg in the Fellowship Hall. Our First Day Rosh Hashanah services will take place the next morning on September 30 beginning at 9:30 am in the Meeting House and they will be followed by Motzi in the Fellowship Hall. Our Beth Shalom Singers and I will officiate at the services accompanied and conducted by Mark Peterson.

The Second day of Rosh Hashanah will take place on Tuesday, October 1, again, in the Meeting House at 9:30 am followed by Motzi in the Fellowship Hall. I will officiate at this service with Mark Peterson accompanying me.

I remind you that this is the one time in the year when it is incumbent upon us all to celebrate **both days of Rosh Hashanah**. You have not fulfilled the Talmudic mitzvah of *Yomah Arichah* (the long day of Rosh Hashanah) if you do not celebrate with us both days. Remember, originally, Rosh Hashanah was a full day observance like Yom Kippur, and, then later, the Rabbis split it into 2 days so that we could celebrate, eat holiday meals together, and blow the shofar the required amount of times properly before sundown each day. So, I ask you to plan and be with us both days of this unique and special holiday of the sounding of the Shofar.

I look forward to seeing you all for the preparatory service of Selihot and the beginning services of this year's High Holyday season. May you all be inscribed in the Book of Life for a healthy and Happy New Year.

A Daily Prayer

The daily prayer said in the morning and evening is called the Shema. In Hebrew this word means *hear*. The first line of the prayer is "Hear O Israel: The Lord our G-d is one." This is the most important sentence in our Jewish religion. It is the bases of all our ethics and morals. Furthermore, it forms the foundation upon which the hopes for a mankind of brotherhood and sisterhood living in peace rests. For us there is just one G-d in the world. The prophet Malachi said that truth in simple words:

"Have we not one Father
Have not one G-d created us
Why then do we deal treacherously
one man against his neighbor?"

In reciting the Shema we swear allegiance to G-d, to the Torah laws of justice, mercy, freedom and equality. This means that we love our people and our countries of the United States of America and Israel. Through them we dedicate our services to the service of G-d his Torah and his chosen people. "Thou Shalt Love the Lord thy G-d"

How can we love G-d? The answer is by trying to imitate him. We try by being just, merciful, and patient as he is. We are all the children of G-d and the family of Abraham and Sarah. We love G-d, as they showed us, with all the impulses of our heart, soul and might.

Might refers to our possessions. We know of those who love their money even more than their lives. Their negative example encourages us to be ready to serve G-d by offering wealth to him through our religious belief, participation and support of Beth Shalom, and in the service of truth, of goodness and justice.

The Lords glory fills the whole world. A sincerely religious person seeks to set G-d always before themselves. And to act as if they were in his presence.

3. Accountability

Accountability...What a perfect month to speak about it. During the High Holy days we are told that we need to be accountable to God and to each other. We need to ask for forgiveness for our "sins" to each other before we can ask for forgiveness from God.

Accountability is a critical element of Sisterhood. Our circle of sisterhood should hold one another accountable for meeting goals, making the right decisions, and being true to oneself. Sisterhood must be answerable, take responsibility for our actions, and provide an accounting in a transparent manner. Everyone must own up to our own responsibilities.
