The times, they are a-changing

Well..... Another successful reunion is in the record books for the Association. The times *are* achanging, as we see the effects of time on all of us. I kept noticing how much older all of my shipmates have gotten since I last saw them, though surely I haven't aged a bit. LOL.

So, what has really changed? Well, several things. Some will be expounded upon in this edition

where more space permits, but let's see what we've got from this reunions Business and Board meetings to share with you.

First, the Scholarship. It's something we wish to continue, as it's one of our legacy programs that we do as a community of shipmates. Figuratively, we're still serving

people. But, pre-Covid, funds were a little more plentiful (not that we're dying right now, but with two years of people withdrawing from the world around them, and no reunions, it was bound to happen that funds would decrease). So we're reducing the award back to 1 at \$500 for the time being, until funds become a little better. What will increase them? I'm glad you asked. That's the next item.

Dues. It's only a yearly thing, so many of us forget about them. But we currently have 46% of our membership in arrears from 1 to 5 years. Why no further in arrears? Well, because 233 members were culled from the roster for non payment of dues. For how far back? Over 5 years (some were as far back as 2008. That's 16 years!). You may be thinking that we just cut off an income source. Well, since they weren't paying, that'd be a no, and many of them were receiving the Press by mail. So they were actually an un-recouped expenditure. They are of course, welcomed to rejoin provided they pay dues each year, so if any of them mention to you that they aren't getting the press any more, well, that's likely why, so tell them to re-apply for membership. I say "likely" because there is another reason possible. That's item three...

The Sunrise Press Newsletter. With dues receipts way down, and our greatest regular expense being the mailing out of the Sunrise Press (just a hair over \$2100/yr), we took a hard look at it, and to print, address, and mail out to the 133 receivers



of the press, that comes out to a little over \$3 per issue per member. "Oh, but some folks don't have a computer at home..." True, but many have a cell phone, and the majority of them are going to be smart phones, which means that the newsletter can be accessed on the website via their phones. "but, but..." Yes, we may

miss one or two somehow, but there are also family members that can print it off for them as well. We have some who have already gone that route, and it works well for them. But the result is that March of 2025 will be the last snail mail version of the Sunrise Press, and will be solely electronic thereafter. You'll get an e-mail with a link to it on our website, just as happens now. Or you can just check out the website in March, July, and November, which is when they are published. Oh... one other change... after 17 years of my doing this for the Association, someone else has volunteered to take over the editing and publication of the newsletter. Stay tuned for the March issue to be introduced to the new editor.

Lastly, the reunion location for next year has been changed from Bremerton, WA due to logistics difficulties not expected. 2025's reunion will be held in Memphis, TN. So, stay tuned for the March and July issues next year to have that info for you.

2024 Reunion, Pensacola Beach, FL

At 10:05AM, the meeting was called to order by President Chris Hagger. Number in attendance 88 Invocation given by Chaplain Hagger Pledge of Allegiance Recognition of 1st time attendees by the President: Daniel Watkins of Abbotstown, PA Austin Green of Shreveport, LA Carmen McDonough of San Diego, CA Treasurer's Report given by Eric Friedli: Despite dues payments being down over last year in currency, and being still below previous years in our financial standing, we are on sound financial footing. Report was moved to be accepted as read by Bob DiMonte, and seconded by Lloyd Friedli. A copy of said financial report is available to any member upon request. Old Business: none New Business: Exploration of attaining 501c3 status and it's financial viability Next year's projected reunion in Bremerton has been tabled due to logistic difficulties previously unforeseen, and its alternative of Memphis, TN was suggested and accepted. Secretary's report of membership and dues: Members as of 1/1/2024: 630 New members this year: 15 New members previous 2 years: (2023) 12, (2022) 16 Associate members: (Surviving family members etc of deceased Member) 64 Lifetime Members: 68 Regular Members: 329 Current Membership: 397 DROPPED FROM ROLLS: 233 * No dues paid since joining: 50 Late 1-5 years in dues: 133 * These were dropped because of non-payment of dues for over 5 years time. Members are welcomed to reapply for membership. The problem is seen in the last two entries of a total of 183 people in arrears on dues. That is a financial loss of \$4575 in potential income. The members removed was another \$5825 not just lost, but denied us by the members thru non-payment, and more when you consider the expenses incurred of mail-outs of the newsletter, as well as letters of dues reminders, etc. Report accepted as read: Recommendations for Reunion Locations for 2026: Odessa, TX put forward by President Hagger; there being no opposition, its viability is now being pursued. Appointments and Nominations: recommendations by Nominating Chairman Bob DiMonte are as follows: President: Chris Hagger for a 2nd term Vice President: Del Florian Secretary: Greg Plante* Treasurer: Eric Friedli*

• These two positions are with the understanding that due to health reasons, there would be a search to find someone amenable to assuming these offices.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Greg Plante, seconded by Carmen McDonough

Meeting adjourned.

🗘 CHAPLAINS CORNER......


This year's reunion was a heartfelt reminder of the strength and love when brothers and sisters dwell together in harmony.


I did meet one U.S.S. Lexington Association's member at this past reunion; his name is Bob Fritsche, he said he was also going to let the members know about this at this coming reunion.


I can send you pictures and brochures if you would like. Greg, I am not sure if you are the proper person to contact, but I know you do the Sunrise Press and I hope you can put something together.




