The Library of Congress is located on 1st Street SE between Independence Avenue and East Capitol Street. The Library offers free, hour-long, docent-led public tours of the Jefferson building, highlighting the building's art and architecture.

Monday - Friday, 10:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m., 2:30 p.m., and 3:30 p.m.

Saturdays at 10:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m., and 2:30 p.m.

No tickets or reservations are required. The Library of Congress Experience, an interactive exhibit in the Jefferson building, is open on Monday - Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. For additional information or questions, call (202) 707-8000, or visit vso@loc.gov.

The National Archives:

The National Archives is located at 700 Pennsylvania Avenue NW. The National Archives are open daily, and admission is free. The museum is open from 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. from March 15 - Labor Day and from 10:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. from the day after Labor Day - March 14. The last person is admitted 30 minutes prior to closing. For a self-guided tour of the National Archives Experience, a reservation is not necessary. If you would like a self-guided tour of the museum at a set time, it is recommended that you make reservations by emailing visitorservices@nara.gov at least six weeks in advance. Self guided tour reservations may be made for times between Monday - Friday 10:15 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. during the spring and summer and between Monday - Friday 10:15 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. during the fall and winter. Self guided tours use the National Archives entrance at Constitution Avenue and 9th Street NW. For a guided tour, call the tour office at 202-357-5450 at least six weeks in advance. Guided tours are available Monday - Friday 9:45 a.m. For guided tours, use the National Archive entrance at Constitution Avenue and 7th Street NW. The Bureau of Engraving and Printing:

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing is located on the corner of 14th and C Street SW. Tours of the Bureau of Printing and Engraving are free and open to the public. However, during the Peak Season of March - August, it is necessary to pick up a free ticket from Raoul Wallenberg Place (formerly 15th Street). The ticket booth distributes same-day tickets and opens at 8:00 a.m. It is recommended that you arrive earlier than 8:00 a.m., as lines form very early, and the booth is frequently out of tickets by 8:30 a.m. Tours of the Bureau occur on weekdays from 9:00 a.m. - 10:45 a.m. and every 15 minutes between 12:30 p.m. - 2:00 p.m. During the summer, additional tours are scheduled every 15 minutes between 2:00 p.m. - 3:45 p.m. and every 15 minutes between 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. Even if you are unable to get free tickets, the Visitors Center is open on weekdays from 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. and from 8:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m. during the summers. Between September and February no tickets or reservations are necessary and tours occur between 9am-10:45am and 12:30pm-2pm. The entrance to the Visitor's Center is on 14th and C Streets. PROHIBITED ITEMS

Before entering the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center, all visitors are screened by a magnetometer, and all items that are permitted inside the building are screened by an x-ray device. Visitors should keep their belongings with them at all times as unattended items may result in a disruption of service at the Capitol.

While certain exceptions for medical needs can be made, the following items are strictly prohibited:

- · Liquid, including water
- Food or beverage of any kind, including fruit and unopened packaged food
- Non-aerosol sprays (Prescriptions for medical needs are permitted.)
- Any bag larger than 18" wide x 14" high x 8.5" deep
- Knives of any size
- Aerosol containers
- Any pointed object, e.g., knitting needles and letter openers. (Pens and pencils are permitted.)
- Electric stun guns, martial arts weapons or devices
- · Guns, replica guns, ammunition and fireworks

- Mace and pepper spray
- · Razors and box cutters

Visitors: The Capitol Visitor Center is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. It is closed on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Presidential Inauguration Days, and Sundays.

Official Business: Visitors with official business appointments may enter the Capitol Visitor Center as early as 7:15 a.m.

- Visitors enter the U.S. Capitol through the Capitol Visitor Center. The entrance is located beneath the east plaza of the Capitol.
- You must pick up your tour pass prior to the tour time printed on your confirmation letter.
 From March through August, please arrive at least 30 minutes early to complete the required security and screening process.
- To visit the Galleries of the Senate or House of Representatives, obtain separate passes from the offices of your Senators or Representative. International visitors may inquire about passes at the Senate or House of Representatives Appointment Desks located inside the Capitol Visitor Center.
- The tour of the historic Capitol includes a 45-minute guided walking tour as well as a 13-minute orientation film. Escalators and elevators are located near the public stairways, and wheelchairs are available upon request at the Visitor Center.
- Please take advantage of Exhibition Hall, the Restaurant, the Gift Shops and the other amenities at the Capitol Visitor Center before or after your tour.
- The U.S. Capitol is subject to the unscheduled suspension of tours.
