

**¿QUE ES LA CAMPAÑA DEL OBISPO?**



Esta Campaña es la fuente primaria de ingresos para sostener y expandir los ministerios en 79 parroquias y misiones, la educación de seminaristas, ofrecer programas de capacitación y liderazgo a la comunidad Hispano, apoyar con la educación religiosa de nuestros niños y jóvenes, mantener oficinas a servir familias y proporcionar servicios sociales a los necesitados en toda la diócesis. La diócesis no puede subsidiar todos los programas necesarios y le pide a las parroquias para que ayuden a nuestros hermanos en necesidad.

**¿POR QUÉ NECESITAMOS MINISTERIOS Y PROGRAMAS?** La iglesia católica responde a las necesidades de muchas personas en la diócesis. Mientras que algunos de estos servicios se ofrecen al nivel de la parroquia, es mucho más eficaz cuando nos unimos todos para los ministerios y para servir a toda la gente de la diócesis.

**¿CÓMO PODEMOS AYUDAR?** En dos formas: (1) Regalo de Oración, es decir, rece para que podemos lograr nuestra meta parroquial de \$14,376 el cual representa \$1,051 menos de lo que recaudamos en 2017 gracias a todos de nuestra parroquia inclusive de la comunidad Hispana; (2) Por Regalo de Abnegación, es decir, considere una promesa durante esta campana de donación semanalmente en la segunda colecta o una donación de un solo pago para apoyar a los ministerios de nuestra diócesis de Savannah. Tendremos diez colectas segundas durante las próximas dos o tres meses como lo hicimos en años anteriores. Gracias por su generosidad.

**REQUISITOS PARA CONFIRMACIÓN:** Un recordatorio para los jóvenes que están preparándose por el Sacramento la Confirmación el 11 de Mayo en nuestro templo. Que sepan antes de la aprobación definitiva a recibir este sacramento tienen que: escribir un ensayo corto al obispo presentando sus "razones de por qué quiero ser confirmada en mayo". También, como fueron informados en septiembre cuando comenzaron sus clases de Formación de Fe, han de haber estado asistiendo regularmente (1) a la misa y también (2) en las clases. Los candidatos aprobados también deben entregar a la señora Judy Wanner, su maestra, el nombre de su patrocinador quien debe ser religiosamente cualificada; identificar el santo por su nombre de Confirmación y los motivos por qué están eligiendo él o ella; ser capaz de responder a las preguntas solicitadas por el Obispo Hartmayer de su Evaluación de la lista de la fe. Antes de la aprobación final, cada candidato tendrá una breve entrevista con el pastor en la iglesia en uno u otro miércoles.


**"Go To A Place of Silence To Listen To Jesus"**



Lent is a time to reclaim our need for silence so we can attune ourselves to the whispers of God's voice. Yet keeping a prayerful silence in church before Mass in the presence of the

Blessed Sacrament seems impossible for some adults. It seems any excuse will do to unnecessarily break the silence to chat. In one of his Lenten homilies, Pope Francis reminds us the first duty of a Christian is to listen to the Word of God, to listen to Jesus! "We need to go...to a place of silence, to find ourselves, to better perceive the voice of the Lord." One of those silent places is Church before the Blessed Sacrament. As Psalm 46 has it: "Be still and know I am your God."

**What Are The Stations of the Cross?** They



are a popular devotion in honor of the Passion and death of Jesus. They consist in meditating on fourteen "stages" or "stations" in Jesus' journey to Calvary. All parishioners are encouraged to prayerfully make the Stations of the Cross during Lent, whether in church at 6 PM on Friday evenings, or from one's pew using a booklet before or after mass, or at home with a booklet.

"Abortion kills twice. It kills the body of the baby and it kills the conscience of the mother. Abortion

**THE LENTEN RICE BOWLS** which have been



distributed to the children in our Faith Formation Classes to be brought home to their families, are also available for the rest of us in the back of the church. We are invited to use them as

another way of Lenten almsgiving, to drop our loose change or more in them as a way to be mindful of the famished in foreign countries and to help feed them. The money one saves from Lenten fasting and abstaining and deposited in the bowls is sent to Catholic Charities in their world wide effort to feed the hungry. As adults are practicing stewardship of treasure in their support of our Bishop's Annual Appeal, our children and youth are to learn to give alms by dropping sacrificial coins in their Rice Bowls during Lent. The sheet enclosed in the Rice Bowl is most instructive for parents to read.
