





# AZ AUTHORS JANUARY 19<sup>TH</sup> – 12:30 - 2:30 AT THE JCC Author/Speaker is Sue Ellen Allen

Sue Ellen Allen is an activist, writer, cancer survivor and... former prisoner. In her book *The Slumber Party From Hell*, she addresses the serious issue of abuse in prisons in general, and here in Maricopa County in particular. Convicted of a white collar crime, her experiences as a prisoner herself led to an assumption of personal responsibility and action: her painfully gathered insights produced a program of hope and repair for those in similar circumstances. Under the protective umbrella of government-sanctioned penal institutions, it often happens that the people responsible for running these institutions overstep their authority. Ms. Allen addresses these issues: What rights does an



incarcerated person have, for example, when ill? Is there a right to treatment? What is the line that determines proper action on the part of the prison administration? How can people serving sentences protect themselves from undue harm? Come hear what she has to say!

ASU Professor Emeritus Joseph Wytko (soprano saxophone) returns with his Saxophone Quartet, which includes his daughter Anna Marie Wytko (baritone saxophone), who is following in his footsteps in academia and on the concert stage. They are joined by Harout Boyajian (alto saxophone) and Kevin Gorman (tenor saxophone), with whom they have recorded and concertized nationwide.

Featured on NPR, they have performed at the White House and throughout the USA and Mexico and are known for their versatility and artistry. Their program will feature music by composers from J.S. Bach to George Gershwin and Scott Joplin.

**JOSEPH WYTKO** is one of America's foremost saxophone soloists and teachers. He has performed as solo recitalist throughout the

United States and in China, France, Belgium, Italy, Poland, Mexico, Canada, and Macedonia. He currently serves as orchestral saxophonist with The Phoenix Symphony and the Arizona Musicfest Orchestra. He received his Bachelor of Music Education degree from West Virginia University, and Master of Music and Doctor of Music degrees from Northwestern University.

ANNA MARIE WYTKO is an Assistant Professor of Music at Kansas State University and Artist-Clinician for the Yamaha Corporation. Dr. Wytko is a summa cum laude graduate of the University of Minnesota, where she also earned her Master of Music and Doctorate of Music degrees. Dr. Wytko has performed as soloist with The Phoenix Symphony Orchestra and the Topeka Symphony Orchestra as well as with numerous university bands and orchestras.

**HAROUT BOYAJIAN** is a member of the music faculty at Chandler High School in Chandler, Arizona, holds Bachelor and Master of Music Education degrees from Arizona State University and has performed with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra and the Tempe Symphonic Winds. His bands have earned many distinctions, including awards from the Arizona Band and Orchestra Association Jazz Festival and the Music Teachers National Association.

**KEVIN GORMAN** holds Bachelor, Master and Doctorate of Music degrees from Arizona State University as well as a Master of Music degree in saxophone performance from Northwestern University. A repeated winner in the prestigious Carmel and Coleman Chamber Music Competitions in California, Dr. Gorman has performed as orchestral saxophonist with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra and the Arizona Musicfest Orchestra.




