

42. Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary)
Roofline features high pedimented front facade with a narrow frieze board and wide overhanging eave supported by scroll brackets with drips. Windows are double-hung 2/2 lights and are treated with segmental arches and lug sills. Exterior iron bars are found on the rear two windows. The front door is topped by large transom lights and treated above with a segmented arch. A stone water table runs



43. History and Significance
The construction of a public "lock-up" was first discussed at the Kelley Island Township Meeting in August 1985. In 1987, stone was ordered from the quarry and construction commenced. The architecture of the building was patterned after a jail at Huron, Ohio. There does not seem to be any historical evidence for the oral tradition that jail cells were removed from the Confed-

3. (Cont'd.) erate Prison on Johnson's Island to be used in this facility. When the building was completed a formal ordinance established it as a jail or station house. Prisoners were paid 37½ cents per day at hard labor for punishment or payment of fine. The amount for their board was not to exceed 0 cents per day. In later years the building also held the mayor's office and council meetings.
