



THE WORD: John1:19-34

¹⁹This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?"

²⁰He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah."

²¹And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the prophet?"

He answered, "No."

²²Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

²³He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord," as the prophet Isaiah said.

²⁴Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. ²⁵They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?"

²⁶John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, ²⁷the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." ²⁸This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

²⁹The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! ³⁰This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' ³¹I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." ³²And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. ³³I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' ³⁴And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."





The Federation of Lutheran Churches in Myanmar contribute art depicting Christmas spirit

The 2021 Christmas card of The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) illustrates the power of the Holy Spirit to inspire Christ-anchored hope in Myanmar and



the world.

"This Christmas is more meaningful than ever. God is continuing to strengthen us and showing us that God is in the midst of suffering and in the midst of injustice, with us," said Mr Luke Andrew, General Secretary of the Federation of Lutheran Churches in Myanmar.

"This art really spoke to me because it depicts the real essence of hope that we find during Christmas."

Using the chosen biblical text "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13), the artist Ms Seint Sanhtay created a scene guided by scripture and anchored

in culture. The art is painted on canvas with acrylic paints and brushes.

"I used the blue because it represents peace, but at the bottom of the painting the blue becomes darker and this represents the darkness of sin. The dove represents the spirit and the people are looking up to the one God in whom we have our hope," said Sanhtay.

"As human beings we seek hope from other people - but that is an illusion of hope - in the end the real hope is only to be found in Jesus Christ - anchored in Jesus and prayer," she continued.
