- Conferences are for adults only. All BHPCNS classes will be held during conferences. Babies are welcome to attend a sibling's conference, however baby-sitting arrangements should be made for older siblings.
- Conferences are an opportunity for BHPCNS to share your child's strengths, concerns, readiness, with you and for you to share what's special, unique or concerning you about your child.
- Working together as a team is important to each child's progress in preschool. Please, do not worry if Liz is at your child's conference. She is there as a resource, support, educator, for your child and family and will offer ideas on your child's development.
- Please let Liz know if you have any questions or would like her to participate in your child's conference.

2025-26 Online Registration begins February 3rd; In person Registration begins March 17th.

Many BHPCNS alumni and current families are exploring both public and private school options for their children. Liz is happy to make introductions to families who currently have kids attending a school of particular interest. Please reach out if you would like her assistance.

#### Montgomery County Public Schools:

The majority of BHPCNS families' children will enroll in Montgomery County Public Schools. MCPS needs to know if your child will be attending one of their schools in the fall of 2025. To register your child for MCPS, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending for next fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September, the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall. Please register your child before March 18th.



#### WHY CROSSING THE MIDLINE IS IMPORTANT

Have you ever wondered, "What is crossing the midline and why is it important?" Here's a brief description and a link to the entire article. The term crossing midline is often used to describe the skill of moving your arm or leg across the imaginary line down the middle of your body. When children can cross the midline, they are using both sides of their brain to coordinate smooth, controlled, complex movements. It is important to combine movement patterns across the body for daily tasks such as reading, writing, tying a bow, and many other life skills. Click here for the entire article.



#### Here are Crossing the Midline Activities for Kids of All Ages:

- 1. Playing with rhythm scarves
- 2. Playing with blocks (stacking)
- 3. Dancing to music
- 4. Dusting or sweeping
- 5. Playing patty-cake
- 6. Playing with cars on a large path bag or ball at a target
- 7. Playing flashlight tag
- 8. Washing the car
- 9. Painting with a large roller

- 10. Completing cross crawls (touching hand to opposite foot or knee)
- 11. Wiping off a table with a towel using one hand
- 12. Throwing a water balloon or bean bag or ball at a target
- 13. Drawing a large figure 8 on a chalkboard or sidewalk
- 14. Playing Simon Says
- 15. Playing Twister



## **BHPCNS SUMMER CAMP 2025 BRADLEY BEAR GOES CAMPING!**

#### Early Drop-off:

Campers may be dropped off at 8:00 am for an additional \$150 per camp session. Drop-in rate is \$20/day. Light snack provided by BHPCNS.

#### Stay & Play:

Campers may stay until 2:30 pm for an additional \$280 per camp session. Drop-in rate is \$35/day. Light snack provided by BHPCNS.

\*An additional \$85 fee for any child who is not fully toilet trained. BHPCNS considers a child fully potty-trained when the child is able to articulate their need to go to the bathroom, can manage their clothing, and does not have recurring accidents at school.

\*\* Must be currently enrolled at BHPCNS for the 24-25 school year and two by December 31, 2024.

"Bea's Bad Day" – Bea deals with her disappointment when her birthday party does not go as planned.


"Finn's Little Fibs" – Finn learns to be brave and tell the truth after he has lied to his grandmother.

#### SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

#### ART(all ages) & SCIENCE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese



In February, our artists and scientists will learn all about magnets. They will conduct experiments to determine what materials a magnet is attracted to, push objects away with like poles, and test the strength of magnets. In art class, students will use magnets to paint.

How do magnets work? Electrons in most materials spin randomly, but in magnets electrons spin in the same direction. This creates a magnetic field that flows out from the north and south poles of the magnet. Magnets with opposite poles attract one another; while magnets with like poles repel each other.

#### SINGING with Ms. Casey (all ages)

In January we talked about new beginnings and resolutions. Looking ahead is a fascinating concept for children so adept at living in the moment but many have expressed a desire to travel to exciting places, learn new skills, and work at honing ones they have (olympic hopes, anyone?) This winter we have the added pleasure of a winter landscape to sing about! Some of our older kids will talk and sing about Martin Luther King and the message of peace and equality he preached. Love is in the air this month and we're learning of all of the ways you can show you care for and love the people around you. From the smallest gestures - like opening doors and helping around the house - to the grandest musical overtures. Get your boom boxes out and raise them high!



#### MUSIC (all ages) with Little Hands



Little Hands winter music semester, "Weather or Not" focuses on musical and meteorological opposites...rain, sun, wind, snow, and more! In February, we'll explore many bird poems and activities, as well as the concepts of "same and different." We recommend the book "No Two Alike" by Keith Baker to discover that we are the same in many ways, and different in other ways, just like birds. We'll continue with LOTS of small percussion instruments and discover what's the same and different in a wide variety of bells. The poem set to song "North Wind Doth Blow" will give us an opportunity to "read" the story with picture cards (attached here) that help us remember the sequence and reinforce "symbol for sound" pre-reading. We LOVE making music with Bradly Bears!
