The oldest trick in the contractor's arsenal, one that is used everyday is simply for the contractor to lowball your budget, to get the job. DON'T FALL FOR IT ! Front end budgets should not be used to select a contractor. It is a tool for financial planning.

Plans reflect the essentials, however leave the material selections to the purchaser. Price of finishes, cabinetry, fixtures can often blow a budget.
