The Event is approaching quickly! This packet includes new details like Saturday meeting time/location, Event Schedule, and re-stating important details. We are no longer accepting additional RSVP'S. We are providing food for lunch/dinner Saturday, and breakfast/lunch Sunday.

Saturday (June3rd) Meeting Details!

FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO REQUESTED TRANSPORTATION IN YOUR RSVP,

Time: we will be <u>LEAVING the office at 6am Saturday (June 3rd).</u> In order to accommodate with our busy schedule for the weekend, we ask that members arrive at least 30 minutes before departure time to give staff and volunteers enough time to pack supplies and finish a head count. There is no promise that we will hold transportation for any late parties.

Meeting place: The address for our Sparks location is 2255 Green Vista Dr. Suite 402. We ask you to park your cars in the highlighted sections below to leave room for other business parking spots. Summit Lake Office is not liable for any damage or theft to your vehicle while you are gone. **Tribal members will be leaving their vehicles at their own risk.**

We will be taking UNR Vans along with company vehicles so your party might be split up, we will try to accommodate to the best of our ability to keep parties together. We have planned to provide transportation for the exact number of RSVPs that requested it, meaning if there was a last-minute addition to your party and we weren't notified, they will need to provide their own transportation!

The event is an overnight stay and vehicles will be returning Sunday Evening. If using our transportation, please try to pack light to make room for other bags.

FOR THOSE PROVIDING THEIR OWN TRANSPORTATION,

The event will officially start at noon on Saturday. Our Provided Transportation will be taking the Denio/Winnemucca way and we invite any tribal members to follow behind our Vans. If you wish to drive up behind our company vehicles, we will be leaving the Sparks location at 6am Saturday morning. You can park temporarily in any spot not highlighted below to leave spaces for those leaving their car overnight.



Liability Information

PLEASE READ FULLY!

IMPORTANT NOTE!! All children under age 18 must have a signed medical release and permission slip designation from the party responsible for the child during the event. This form was attached/ enclosed with the RSVP. A copy may be sent by request. Children will not be able to board a shuttle vehicle and participate in activities without an accompanying parent/relative and signed forms. Children under age 10 MUST be accompanied by a parent or relative responsible for them for the weekend.

Summit Lake Paiute Tribe won't be liable for any property that you bring up being stolen, lost, or broken. It is recommended that any vehicles being brought up be all-terrain vehicles because of the conditions of the dirt roads. It is also recommended to have at least one spare tire (maybe two if your vehicle doesn't have all-terrain tires) with you when driving up. Gas will not be for sale on the reservation but will be available in Gerlach or Winnemucca. Due to the risk of invasive species introduction, no personal boats are allowed to be brought up. Wi-Fi is available at the reservation but will only be available in case of emergencies, no additional cell coverage is available at the reservation.

SUMMIT LAKE PAIUTE TRIBE PROHIBITS BRINGING ANY ALCOHOL, DRUGS, OR FIREARMS ONTO THE RESERVATION.

Supply List (please bring on your own, these items won't be provided)



- Sleeping bag, sleeping pad, extra blankets, pillows.
- Tent(s) (if able to bring your own) If you requested housing be aware that tents will be group housing and you will
 not be receiving individual tents for your party!
- Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.)
- Warm pajamas (night temperatures can get VERY cold so be prepared)
- Close-toed shoes/ layered outdoor clothing (we recommend bringing clothing that is comfortable to move around in and you don't mind getting dirty. NO FLIP FLOPS OR SANDALS!)
- Raingear
- Sunscreen and tick/insect repellent. This year, ticks are at an all-time high!
- Stories and/or games
- Flashlights/ lamps/headlamps (may want to bring extra batteries)
- Portable charger for electronics
- First aid kits
- Hats
- Reusable water bottle. Refill stations will be provided, help limit the amount of plastic on your reservation!
- SOS/Garmin devices if needed.
- · Binoculars/spotting scope for wildlife viewing.
- Medication (any prescribed medications, ibuprofen, aspirin, Dramamine)
- Cameras.
- Backpacks/daypacks
- Fishing gear (if planning to fish); nets, waders, coolers and ice for transportation, and poles
- Signed permission slips and medical releases (if child is under 18 years old)
- · Folding chairs
- Car seats and highchairs if needed.

Fishing Requirements

Because of the number of people that will be up at the reservation that weekend, The Tribal Council has declared that the fish limit for an individual will be **1 fish per tribal member**. This will only apply during this event (June 3rd-June 4th) and will go back to the previously stated fish limit after the event has concluded (June 5th). Fishing in Summit Lake is only open to tribal members and their family. All tribal members wanting to fish must bring their fishing permits. As per the tribal fishing regulations, "the use of live bait, chumming, gaff hooks, spears, traps, wire fences, or other implements to take fish is prohibited. Mahogany Creek is closed to all fishing in and above the fish trap and 100 yards below the fish trap (marked by the fence crossing the stream) from March 1 to June 15". Attendees will be able to fish Sunday morning during the free time portion of the weekend (June 4th). No fishing equipment will be available to be lent out to members, all fishing equipment must be self-provided. There will be a disinfectant station that any attendees fishing will be required to use before entering Summit Lake's water.
