¹³ But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John. ¹⁸ Zechariah said to the angel, "How can I know that this will happen? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years." ¹⁹ The angel replied, "I

am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. ²⁰ But now, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time, you will become mute, unable to speak, until the day these things occur." Luke 1:13, 18-20

Thank you for reading through the New Testament for one year. As we being a new church year on December 1st, Beginning December 1, we will return to reading the assigned readings for each Sunday. This church year we will be studying Luke.

The above passage is from the first chapter in Luke. We hear that Elizabeth and Zachariah are "getting on in years" and supposedly well past, childbearing age. HOWEVER, if God says it is to be – <u>it will happen</u>. Zachariah (like most of us who are getting on in age would also do) did not believe. As a result, God caused Zachariah's unbelief to be seen by the community that day, and to be read about by us 2,000 years later. Zacharia was not able to speak until John was born and the story continues until verse 64: ⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. If God says it is to be – <u>it will happen</u>.

As we enter this season of Advent, we find ourselves both hopeful and waiting. Hopeful that the world will be a place of peace and joy. We also wait as we watch what God is doing in the world in which we live. I wish you a season of waiting and watching. Waiting for the next coming of Christ. Waiting for what God has planned for you and your family. Waiting to see how the Spirit blows in your life.

There are many opportunities to come and worship as a community this Advent season. Wednesdays in Advent, meals each Wednesday by the youth, children nativity rehearsals and costume choosing, choir and handbell practice for a blessed Christmas Eve service, reverse Advent boxes – and so much more...just keep reading this newsletter for more and more activities.

We are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus – and we continue our journey as we also wait.



through the January 7th worship service.)








Shock and Claus


