As much as I would like to continue giving all of my energy to this ministry, the pandemic certainly opened my eyes to the dangers of spreading myself too thin.

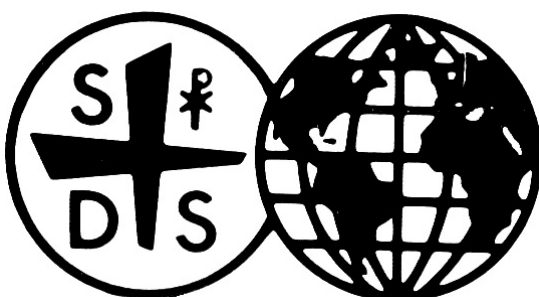
Emerging from the pandemic?

Thank God we could start classes this Monday. Our children cannot follow classes on line, so we implemented a program so that small groups of student come to the schools a few days per week. That way they can learn something and we can feed them. It is very limited but at least we can do something.

I hope you are well. I heard that vaccination goes very fast in the United States. Good news that in at least one part of the world things are moving forward. Here things are quite slow as usual but we still hope that little by little we can improve. What worries us the most is that the schools are still closed. Last year I requested for help to aid poor and needy school children who find it difficult to feed themselves at school due to economic hardship. These children who live on the islands of the Oti River and the near hinterlands have great yearning for a bright future.

The arrival of the bags of rice during this pandemic was unprecedented. Hence there were over 1000 school children that turned up as beneficiaries of the rice in these communities.

The bags of rice were sent to them across the lake to the various schools. The community chiefs, heads, assembly man, some parents and heads of the schools with the teachers were invited to witness the sharing of the 100 bags of rice to all the school children at the school.

We express our limitless thanks to you for such priceless act of kindness to us in these difficult moments. What a timely relief to us to save such the under privileged school children from hunger during these bad days of the covid -19.

The Chief expressed his thanks and joy saying, "God did not only visit us through Jesus Christ but through Salvatorian Mission Warehouse to fill our children's stomachs for good work and the future."

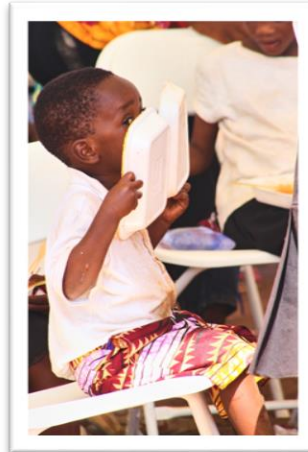
