

Video slots are the most common type and feature elaborate themes(often based on movies, TV shows, or popular culture, plus numerous paylines and exciting bonus rounds. Examples include:

- **Dragon Link:** Known for its Asian-inspired graphics, Hold & Spin feature, and potential for progressive jackpots.
- **Lightning Link**: Features bright graphics and a Hold & Spin bonus feature that has become very influential in slot game design.
- **Huff n More Puff:** A whimsical game based on the Three Little Pigs story with progressive free games and a House Blowing feature.
- Rich Little Piggies: A personal favorite this is a farm-themed game with Hold & Spin mechanics and expanding symbols.
- Wheel of Fortune: A classic with numerous versions, progressive jackpots, and bonus rounds.

While video slots are more prevalent, traditional reel slots with physical reels still have a dedicated following.



Popular examples include:

- **Triple Red Hot 7s:** A high-volatility classic slot known for multipliers.
- **Double Jackpot:** Another classic Bally Technologies slot with significant multiplier opportunities.
- **Double Diamond:** A classic slot machine game known for giving away big wins.

Progressive slots link across multiple casinos, contributing to a continually growing jackpot until a lucky player wins it all. Popular progressive slots include:

• **Megabucks:** Renowned for its massive, life-changing payouts

- Wheel of Fortune: Many versions offer progressive jackpots
 - Dragon Link
 - Mega Moolah

Finally, we have Penny Slots: Despite the name, these slots often allow for larger bets per line but are popular for stretching a budget and offering extended play sessions. Some popular penny slot games include:

Gaming News

World Series Poker winner

Poker superstar Michael Mizrachi won this year's World Series of Poker in July, raking in a cool \$10 million, raising his lifetime tournament winnings to \$29 million, and earning his eighth WSOP bracelet. He'd already won the WSOP Poker Players Championship this year for the fourth time. Mizrachi was down to three blinds on Day 8, just this close to being eliminated, when he mounted an epic comeback, making the final table with the second highest chip count. On Day 2 of the Final Table, he busted out two of the remaining four players in the first two hands and took down the championship in 24 total hands. Leonore "Leo" Margets, only the second woman to reach the final table in WSOP history, was eliminated in seventh place, winning \$1.5 million; she had the fifth highest chip count at the beginning of Day 1.

Gaming Hall of Fame inductees

This year's inductees to the American Gaming Association's Gaming Hall of Fame are David Berman, Ann Simmons Nicholson, and Charles Lombardo. The Hall of Fame "hon-

ors the visionaries who've shaped today's gaming industry." Berman is a gaming merger-and-acquisitions specialist with more than 100 M&As under his belt worth more than \$125 billion. Nicholson is strategic planning and organizational consultant who, over a 40-year career, has worked with nearly every major gaming company, supporting more than 60 property openings, expansions, and acquisitions. And Lombardo's career spans more than 50 years in slot operations and game innovation; he's held senior leadership roles at Caesars Palace, Bally's, Paris, and Seminole Gaming.

Joey Chestnut does it again

Joey "Jaws" Chestnut made a triumphant return to the Nathan's July 4th Hot Dog Eating Contest after a year's absence due to a contract dispute. He scarfed 70.5 hot dogs in the allotted 10 minutes in front of a lively crowd at Coney Island and took back the Mustard Belt, plus the \$10,000 first-place prize. It was his 17th win in the contest and his 10th in the last 11 years, but he didn't beat his own record of 76 hot dogs in 2021. Patrick Bertoletti, who won last year's competition, was a distant second, downing a mere 46.5 dogs and buns. In the women's contest, reigning champion Miki Sudo won again by eating 33 dogs, way short of her record 51 last year.

Vegas prices too high?

A recent edition of the venerable

London-based Times has an article titled Viva Las Vegas? Tourists shun Sin City over 'ridiculous prices.' Here are the first three paragraphs: "On a sweltering morning as tourists line up for pictures with the famous welcoming sign, one topic of conversation dominates: When did Las Vegas become so expensive? Hannah Warren, a 50-year-old assistant costume designer from Essex, was still reeling from paying \$33 for coffee and a bagel at Fontainebleau. Gary Langlois, a 65-year-old retired salesman from Minneapolis, paid \$40 for two coffees and a couple of croissants. That is on top of the resort fees, parking charges, and various other costs that have become a fact of life for Las Vegas tourists." The early conclusion: "Now, after a post-pandemic boom, there are signs the Strip has pushed visitors to a tipping point" and then come the numbers we all know and love, the ongoing drop in visitation and gross gaming revenue. The "ridiculous prices" in the headline are a direct quote from Anthony Curtis, the most widely recognized and quoted expert on Las Vegas in the world, who was interviewed for the story.

Bingo capital of the U.S.?

No, it's not Las Vegas. In fact, even considering the entire state, Nevada isn't close. A report by gambling. com pegs Montana as the easy bingo capital of the U.S. and likely the world, with 28.4 bingo halls per 100,000 residents. Vermont is a distant second at 8.2 bingo halls. Montana has 324; Pennsylvania has the most at 702. Nevada? It ranks 45th in the U.S. with just 24 bingo halls, which is .7 per 100,000 residents. Hawaii and Tennessee have no bingo halls.

Death Bingo?!

We receive quite a few questions about bingo variants around the world and online. The following information aims to answer all the questions in one go!

At the heart of North American bingo culture lies the 75-ball variant, known for its creative patterns that players aim to complete on their 5x5 grid with 25 squares.

Across the pond, 90-ball bingo reigns supreme, especially in the UK, Australia, and parts of Europe. Characterized by its 9x3 grid (27 squares total); this version unfolds over three stages: one line, two lines, and finally, a full house, where all numbers on a card are called. The gradual buildup and multiple winners make 90-ball bingo a fun social experience.

Less common Bingo variations include:

--Speed bingo: primarily played online: with 30 balls and a compact 3x3 grid, games are fast-paced and can be completed in just a few minutes.

--80-ball bingo: this version emerged in the U.K. and is now particularly popular on online platforms there; it consists of a 4x4 grid with 16 squares; balls are divided into four color-coded groups.

-Flash Fives (52-5 bingo) where players are dealt hands from a deck of cards, and the goal is to cover five cards on their ticket as the dealer reveals the deck card by card. Available at some bingo locations and online sites/apps.

--U-Pick'Em Bingo, where players select their own numbers on a bingo card. Often played in conjunction with traditional bingo games, U-Pick'Em is found at various bingo locations, online and off.

-Death Bingo: In the shadowy corners of the bingo world lies Death Bingo, a variant that mixes dark humor with a dash of suspense. Here, the stakes are high, and tensions tend to rise, as the first person to shout "Bingo!" is, ironically, eliminated from the game. This twist keeps players on the edge of their seats, as they balance the thrill of nearing victory with the looming threat of elimination. Perfect for Halloween parties, Death Bingo turns the traditional goal of bingo on its head. But maybe a better name would be White Out Bingo?





Veterans Post Disability benefits

You know it's a scam when they want you to pay for their help in filing Department of Veterans Affairs disability claims. Then when you receive the benefits, they make you give them a percentage of the money.

Ten thieves were recently nailed for defrauding the VA. The grand jury came back with 49 counts of conspiracy and fraud, including wire and mail fraud. The ringleader was a VA employee in charge of claims clerks. He was able to give certain claims to certain clerks who could follow his instructions to assign false medical conditions to specific veterans to

There was a veteran who was with the Department of Homeland Security, and several more. They even dragged a wife, mother and sister into the fraud.

In exchange for cash upfront, the veterans were all able to receive high disability ratings after being told what to put on their paperwork and what to say during medical exams.

Of course they're all going to pay. Some of them, if convicted, could get up to five years in prison, and some could receive up to 20 years if convicted of the crimes that included mail and wire fraud.

Remember: You never have to pay for help in filing for benefits. You never have to give someone a percentage of what you get. Free help is available from various Veterans Service Organizations such as the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and even the VA itself. Don't let yourself be used in a scam against the VA.

And so I left the stain where it was. Buttoned up my coat, straightened my tie, and headed out with a little more swagger than usual. After all, in Bingo—as in life—it's not always about the first card you play. Sometimes, it's about how you carry yourself between the calls.

being on their best behavior, playing their Bingo and going home.

Frankly, I prefer a person in charge who cracks the whip. Not that I ever want to be yelled at, but everyone who walks in there knows what to expect and is going to toe the line.

That said, however, there should be a degree of openness on his part if there is something going on that the players aren't happy with—the speed of the games, for example. They are putting down their money to be there and should have some voice in the operation.

I'm curious if he is this way with the workers. I doubt it, because they would certainly be the first ones to walk out if he was bullying them as well. So, my suggestion would be to speak to a worker if there is an issue and ask them to resolve it.

If this fails, then there is always a petition—a thoughtfully written letter to the manager explaining players' concerns and suggested changes. It should not be a list of grievances. The petition would also require multiple signatures to emphasize its importance to many players.

Hopefully, the manager will appreciate the time, effort, and diplomacy reflected in the petition and be open to the comments and suggestions it contains. —*Guy*

DEAR PAWS: I don't see the point of vaccinating a pet, especially if they're kept inside for most of their lives. I've read that vaccines can cause more harm than good. So why bother to vaccinate? — Natural Pet Parent

DEAR NATURAL: You couldn't be more wrong. A pet's immune system is not an invulnerable shield; it's a constantly adapting system that has to "learn" what microbes and viruses are threats and which are not. Unfortunately, some diseases cause serious illness or death before a pet's immune system can respond to them.

Vaccines contain a safe, weakened or killed version of a pathogen, allowing the immune system to produces\ antibodies to attack that pathogen and they remember that in the future.

A disease like rabies, which is fatal, is best fought off by a vaccine. For example, if a vaccinated cat is attacked and bitten by a rabid fox or raccoon, a veterinarian will give the cat a booster shot and monitor the cat in quarantine for 30 to 60 days. An unvaccinated cat who is attacked by a rabid animal might be euthanized immediately, or quarantined for up to 4 months.

Because there is no such thing as 100% prevention from exposure to various diseases, even your indoor pets need to have their vaccinations.



Dividing possessions

Dear Savvy Senior,

Do you have any suggestions on divvying up my personal possessions to my kids after I'm gone without causing hard feelings or conflict? I have a lot of jewelry, art, family heirlooms and antique furniture, and four grown kids that don't always see eye-to-eye on things.—**Conflicted Parent**

Dear Conflicted,

Divvying up personal possessions among adult children or other loved ones can often be a tricky task. Deciding who should get what without showing favoritism, hurting someone's feelings or causing a feud can be difficult, even for close-knit families who enter the process with the best of intentions. Here are a few tips to consider that can help you divide your stuff with minimal conflict.

Sweating the Small Stuff

For starters, you need to be aware that it's usually the small, simple items of little monetary value that aren't mentioned in your will that cause the most conflicts. This is because the value we attach to the small personal possessions is usually sentimental or emotional, and because the simple items are the things that most families fail to talk about.

Family battles can also escalate over whether things are being divided fairly by monetary value. So, for items of higher value like your jewelry, antiques and art, consider getting an appraisal to assure fair distribution. To locate an appraiser in your area, try ISA-appraisers.org, Appraisers.org or AppraisersAssociation.org.

Dividing Fairly

The best solution for passing along your personal possessions is for you to go through your house with your kids or other heirs either separately or all at once to find out which items they would like to inherit and why. They may have some emotional attachment to something you're not aware of. If more than one child wants the same thing, you'll have to make the ultimate decision.

Then you need to sit down and make a list of who gets what on paper, signed, dated and referenced in your will. You can revise it anytime you want. You may also want to consider writing an additional letter or create an audio or video recording that further explains your intentions.

You can also specify a strategy for divvying up the rest of your property. Here are some popular methods that are fair and reasonable:

Take turns choosing: Use a round-robin process where your kids take turns choosing the items they would like to have. If who goes first becomes an issue, they can always flip a coin or draw straws. Also, to help simplify things, break down the dividing process room-by-room, versus tackling the entire house. To keep track of who gets what, either make a list or use adhesive dots with a color assigned to each person to tag the item.

HOMEMADE BARBECUE SAUCE

- 1 8-ounce bottle sweet and sour dress-
- 1 quart-bottle barbecue sauce—any one you chose
- 6 ounces chili sauce
- 2 tablespoons hoisin sauce (Chinese food section)
- 2 tablespoons honey


Combine all of the above ingredients in an appropriately sized saucepan. Heat over a low flame for at least 10 minutes. Serve with ribs, chicken, beef or whatever you choose.

BAKED BEANS-THE EASY WAY

- 4 bacon slices
- 1 28-ounce can pork and beans
- 1 small onion, diced
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup sorghum syrup or honey
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce ½ teaspoon dry mustard

Cook the bacon in a skillet or the microwave for 3 to 4 minutes. Cut into 1-inch pieces. In a one quart, lightly greased baking dish, combine the remaining ingredients. Add the bacon. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Makes 4 to 6 servings.





How poker math kept me alive

I recently played a tough hand in a \$1,000 buy-in tournament that I think is incredibly educational. With blinds at 400/800/800, a loose, aggressive player raised to 1,800 out of his 30,000 stack from third position at a nine-handed table. I found pocket Jacks on the button and three-bet to 4,400 out of my 25,000 stack.

The purpose of my somewhat small three-bet size is to allow my opponent to call and see a flop with a hand that I frequently dominate while also giving him plenty of room to get out of line and put in a four-bet, potentially all in.

To my surprise, another loose, aggressive player four-bet all-in for 25,000 from the small blind.

The action folded around to the initial raiser who thought for about 15 seconds before announcing, "All in." That was not what I expected!

Now I have to figure out both players' ranges and then see how my pocket Jacks fare. The small blind almost certainly has a snug range, perhaps A-A thru 9-9, A-K, and maybe A-Q. Against this range, Jacks is in decent shape, winning 50% of the time. The initial raiser, who pushed all in on top of the small blind's all-in four-bet, certainly has an incredibly strong range, perhaps only A-A thru J-J and A-K.

Against this tight range, Jacks wins only 36% of the time. Against both players combined, Jacks wins 28% of the time. That is not too often!

While I am getting decent pot odds – I have to put in 20,500 to win a 56,000 pot – I am getting roughly a break-even price. To calculate my pot odds, you take the amount I have to call (20,500) and divide it by the amount I have to call plus the current pot (20,500 + 56,000 = 76,500). This means I need to win 20,500/76,500 = 26% of the time to justify calling.

Since I will win 28% of the time and I only need to win 26% based on the pot odds, calling will return a tiny profit. However, in a tournament, you should strive not go broke. Calling in this situation will result in me going broke 72% of the time. That is not ideal.

It is worth noting that I may have made a mistake in estimating my opponents' ranges. They may be a bit tighter than I estimated. If they are tighter than expected, my call quickly becomes unprofitable. Of course, they could also be much looser, but you will find that very few players are trying to get their money in poorly.

Taking all these factors into account, plus the fact that I think I play better most of my opponents in this \$1,000 buy-in event, I should fold, which is what I did. Fortunately for me, the small blind had A-K and the initial raiser had Kings. By understanding the math behind this situation, I avoided going broke, allowing me to continue playing the tournament and finding profitable situations in the future.

The headline in the SFGate.com story is, Reviled A's owner bought \$29.25M Las Vegas mansion in secret deal. It goes on to report that it's "one of the most expensive home sales in Las Vegas history." The house sits on nearly an acre with 12,000-square-

feet of indoor-outdoor living space, 10 bathrooms, a three-car garage, movie theater, and a "comprehensive fitness/ wellness room." Located in Summerlin, it's within the gated Summit Club, "which bills itself as the only private residential lifestyle club" in Las Vegas. Membership is a \$250,000-\$400,000 initiation and an annual fee of \$110,000-\$120,000. There's an 18-hole golf course, a clubhouse with pool, dining, spa and recreation room, as well as on-site courts for basketball, tennis, and pickleball. "Only two sales have hit or crossed the \$30 million mark in Las Vegas history, one sold by Celine Dion for \$30 million in 2023 and the other for \$35 million in 2024, and both are located right next to each other inside the Summit Club."




