From the Board Treasurer

We are striving to operate under “the divine decrees” and “the law of Love, in which nature and God are one and the natural order of heaven comes down to earth” (Science and Health, p. 189), as when Jesus *multiplied* the loaves and fishes rather than attempting merely to divide what was evidently available to the human senses.

A brief summary of our finances as of the end of calendar year 2012: We have about \$500,000 in liquid assets. Our operating loss for the year was about \$86,000, compared to a loss of \$151,000 for 2011.

Our occupancy rates and patient revenues have been increasing steadily throughout the past year, and especially during recent months. In fact, in January and February we had a full house for the entire two months and patient revenue covered virtually all expenses. Even with the increased occupancy, expenses seem to be holding steady. Income is exclusively from patient revenue and donations; we have no investment income at this time. Based on pro forma projections, we think we will need annual donations of about \$150,000 to cover operating expenses. Currently donations are running at a steady \$60,000 per year. Rob Askew
