

The Stations of the Cross

Our Lady of the Visitation Catholic Church

The stations of the cross has deep historical meaning and practice in the history of Christianity. Early Christians visited the holy sites in Jerusalem where Jesus underwent his passion, and when Christianity finally became legal to practice in the early 4th century some shrines were built up at different moments along the way of the cross that Jesus walked and endured.

The Franciscans would revitalize this practice in the mid to late 1300s in the Holy Land. This devotional practice did not become fully organized, uniform, and widespread outside of Jerusalem until the 1500s and into the 1600s around Europe. Catholic Churches were allowed and encouraged to put the traditional 14 stations of the Cross in their church buildings starting in the middle of the 1700s. Nowadays, there are so many beautiful images and artistic representations of what Christ suffered for our sake and out of love for us 2,000 years ago in Jerusalem. There are also many various booklets and devotionals to help you pray with the stations and reflect on Jesus love for you, which becomes present to us in our prayer and in the Sacraments!

May we ask God this Lenten season to help us rediscover our love for Jesus on the Cross so that we can open our hearts to receive that love, and also unite ourselves to Jesus on the Cross today and every day of our lives.


V: We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You. (Genuflect).




Were you married in 1975?




