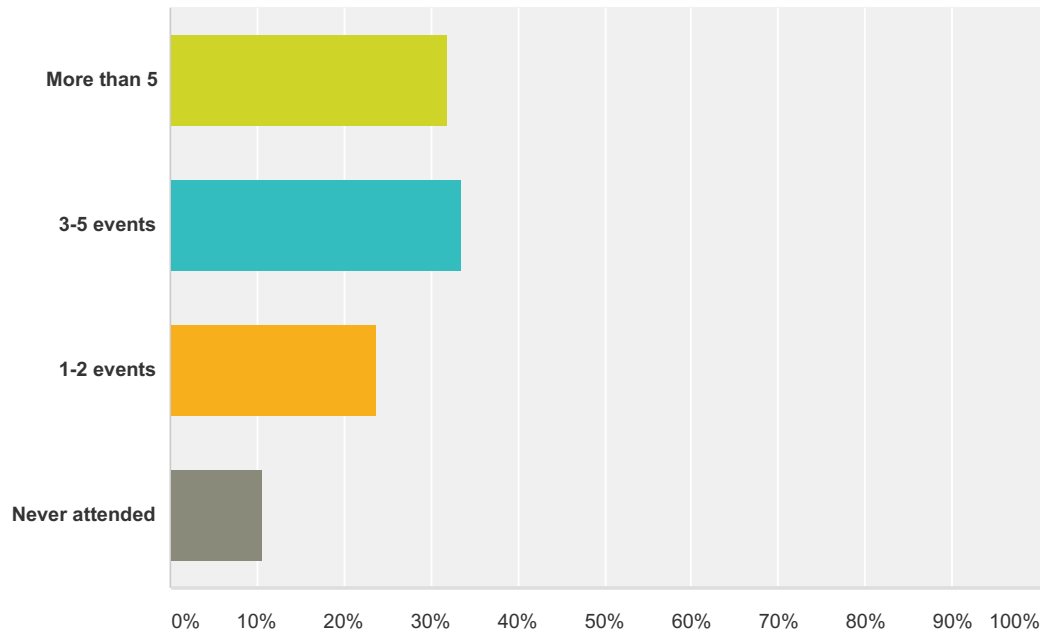


Q1 In the last two years, how many events have you or any of your family members attended at Clark Historic Farm?

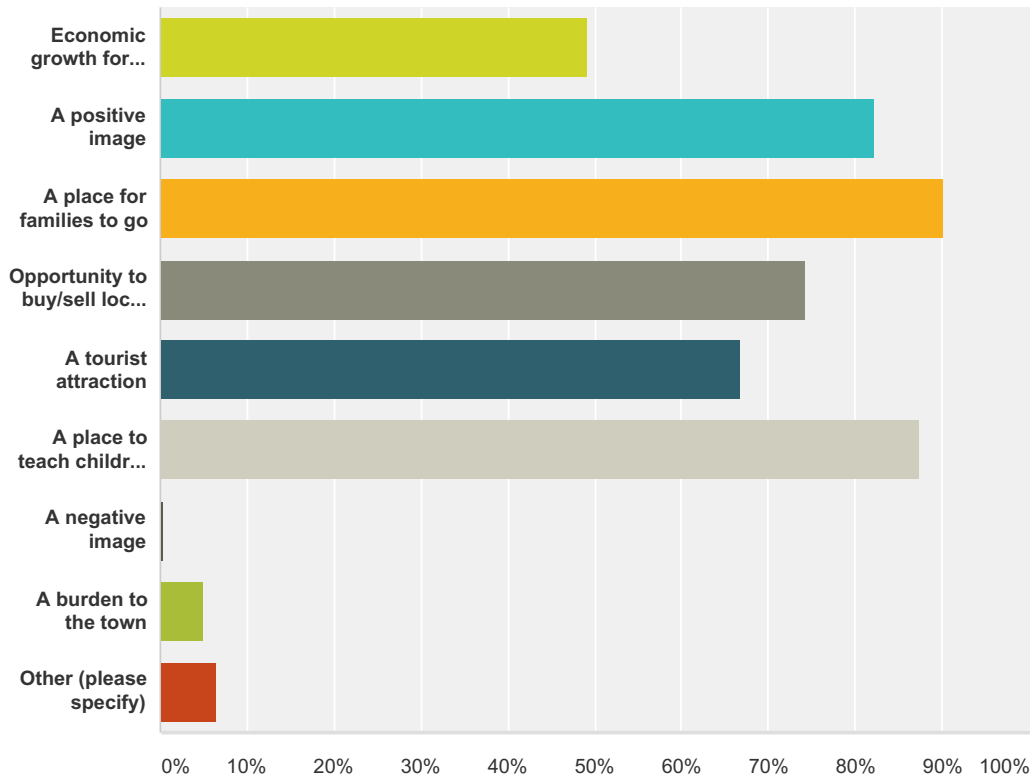

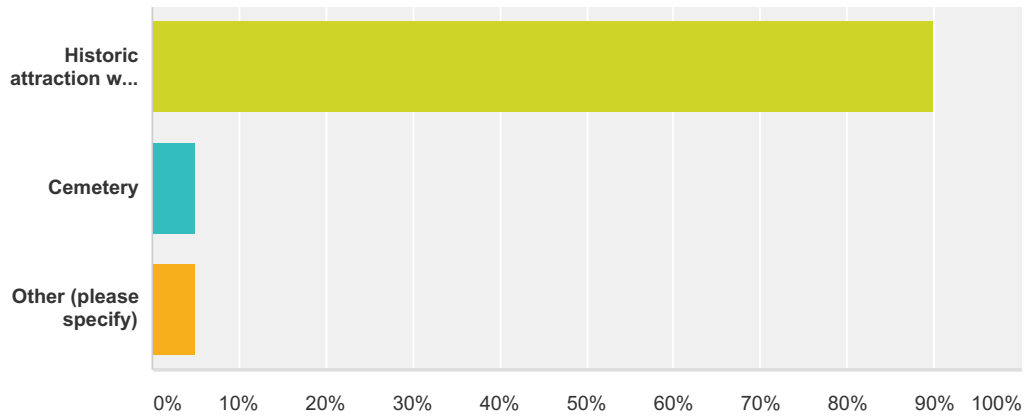
