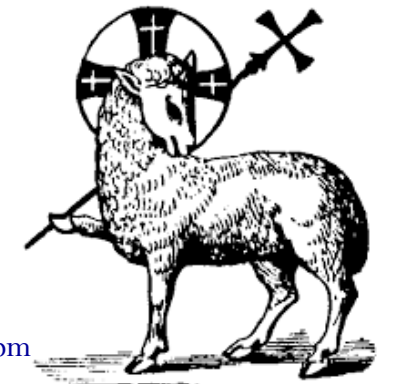

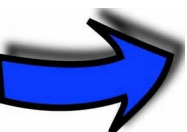


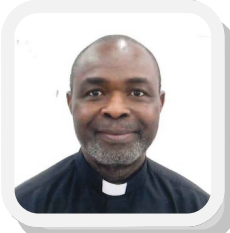

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Presence of Christ by the Power of His Word and the Holy Spirit

1381 "That in this sacrament are the true Body of Christ and his true Blood is something that 'cannot be apprehended by the senses,' says St. Thomas, 'but only by faith, which relies on divine authority.' For this reason, in a commentary on Luke 22:19 ('This is my body which is given for you.'), St. Cyril says: 'Do not doubt whether this is true, but rather receive the words of the Savior in faith, for since he is the truth, he cannot lie.'"

Godhead here in hiding, whom I do adore Masked by these bare shadows, shape and nothing more, See, Lord, at thy service low lies here a heart Lost, all lost in wonder at the God thou art.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA

La presencia de Cristo por el poder de su Palabra y del Espíritu Santo

1381 «La presencia del verdadero Cuerpo de Cristo y de la verdadera Sangre de Cristo en este sacramento, "no se conoce por los sentidos, dice santo Tomás, sino sólo por la fe, la cual se apoya en la autoridad de Dios". Por ello, comentando el texto de san Lucas 22, 19: "Esto es mi Cuerpo que será entregado por vosotros", san Cirilo declara: "No te preguntes si esto es verdad, sino acoge más bien con fe las palabras del Salvador, porque Él, que es la Verdad, no miente"» (MF 18; cf. Santo Tomás de Aquino, Summa theologiae 3, q. 75, a. 1; San Cirilo de Alejandría, Commentarius in Lucam 22, 19):

Adoro Te devote, latens Deitas, Quae sub his figuris vere latitas: Tibi se cor meum totum subjicit,

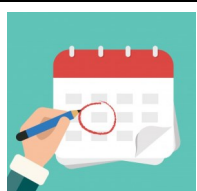
