

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

20th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 12:49-5

How great is my anguish until it is accomplished! (Lk 12:50) Jesus has a job to do, and He wants to 'get it done'! Compare this exclamation of Jesus', to Blessed Simeon's statement of relief when He realizes that his life's purpose is fulfilled. In Luke 2:29-30, Simeon sighs with a sense of completion, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace....my eyes have seen your salvation." What a satisfying sign-off! Simeon's job is accomplished! I am sure that we all have all at some time faced a big task and felt such joy when the end did come – (Like MLK's sermon prophecy looking forward to the day when all God's children can claim, "Free at last!") That is what we are after! To hear God tell us, "Well done, good and faithful servant" Matthew 25:23). Well, at this point in the gospel Jesus is not there yet, but He is progressing toward such a satisfying end! We will hear him claim such a completion of His mission, when He is on the cross and He cries out, "It is finished" (John 19:30) At that point, Jesus had accomplished His purpose, redeeming our human nature by becoming one with us (fully revealing the Way to the Father!) Yet, we are not fully there yet! Jesus has gone ahead, and we are still to follow Him!

But also, this exclamation of Jesus is a wonderful expression of how Jesus understands and relates to us, sharing with us in all of our hearts' longings, as the Second Vatican Council Document Gaudium Et Spes declared them, our ""joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties" (GS1). Pope Francis' last encyclical "Dilexit Nos" (Latin for "He Loved Us") is an extended meditation upon the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is *aflame* for love of us. Francis quotes St Bonaventure who outlines how our hearts should '*long for' Christ's heart with a 'raging fire'* seeking union with Him ('heart to heart' as St John Newman teaches). The fuller quote of St Bonaventure describing Christ's heart whose desire is to draw us in to Him, is "but the fire totally inflaming and transporting one into God both by its excessive unctions and by its most ardent affections... Who indeed is this God of fire" (Bonaventure 'Journey of Mind into God' chp 7, no 6). 'Unctions' is an archaic way of saying, 'deepest feelings' 'commiserative emotions' or 'strongly shared empathy'. This wonderfully captures the 'longing' that Jesus feels for us and for competing his mission of bringing us, or reuniting and reconciling us to the Father, by awakening our hearts to their true desire-God Himself. Pope Francis' encyclical is great reading material for this Jubilee Year of Hope. It reflects upon this same burning love Jesus expresses in our gospel reading today. It is all captured perfectly in the image of Jesus' Sacred Heart. Similar to the expression, sung by the 1970's rock group Cheap Trick, Jesus 'wants us to want Him' God loves us first to stir up our love for Him in return (1 John 4:19).

Another time in the gospel when Jesus expresses this burning love of us, is when He prays on the Mount overlooking the Holy City, and cries, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem,...... how many times *I yearned* to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her young under her wings, but you were unwilling")(Matthew 23:37). Jesus wants to draw us close to Himself, and to one another. Yet how do we respond? Some answer and some do not. Some answer affirmatively and some do not. How we answer, brings up the second part of today's reading that speaks about division and a lack of peace. It is how we choose. Jesus isn't intentionally divisive, and He doesn't taunt us over differences (as many politicians do today). His talk of divided households or families is all about generational differences. Notice his numerical breakdowns, 2 against 3 and 3 against 2 (assuming five as the total, He doesn't say "4 against 1 and 1 against 4). Also, notice His relationship descriptions, father-son and mother-daughter. He doesn't say "brother against sister and sister against brother". It's generational. He is speaking about the New Covenant, a new era of relationships, a new generation. Jesus teaches that there is no presumed dominance of anyone over the other simply because of a title or position. We are all children of God, and are not to lordly exert our familial position over others. (this is similar to his calling out of abuse and exploitation based on one's office or title 'Rabbi, Father, Master' in Matt 23:8-10 right before He denounces the Pharisees). So, Jesus longs to usher in this New Generation of relating to one another as fellow brothers and sisters all seeking to do and love the Father's will together. One can not be made to do it, but that is exactly where love and the heart come in. It is the moving fire of a person's charity, that we may motivate others to share and reciprocate Christ's love to embody the difference God wishes for the human family. That we be one again (John 17:21) a self-chosen loving unity - not obligated by familial dynasty (baptismal water is thicker than racial blood). Jesus desires us to be one as God created us to be and as Jesus died for us to become again. Peace, Fr Brian
