Fireworks Ordinance No. 16-02

All fireworks are prohibited except certain "common" or "safe and sane" fireworks. Common fireworks are only allowed from noon on July 3rd until midnight on July 4th. Copies of the full ordinance can be found on the website at www.rockfordwa.com. It is the policy of the Town of Rockford to conform to Federal and State policies with reference to the subject matters of this ordinance. The provisions of this ordinance notwithstanding, it shall be unlawful to use, explode or detonate fireworks and cap pistols in a promiscuous, careless manner. Have a fun and safe Independence Day!

We cannot stress the importance of what can and can't go into the town's wastewater treatment facility. EVERYTHING that goes into the toilet, or down your drain, comes out at the WWTF. Many of these items cause damage to the treatment facility and prevent the process from working the way it should. It costs the town in wages and parts (and often professional services) to repair damaged areas. In addition to these expenses, foreign substances cause misreads on our required testing, which can lead to violations and fines. "Disposable" wipes do not break down. Neither do Q-tips, diapers, pills, paper towels, feminine products, grease, fats and oils. Nothing should go down the drains except

human waste and toilet paper.
