

March 17, 2019 **Second Sunday of Lent** Lk 9:28b-36

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Lent is a time of change! Change doesn't come easy. As I mentioned last week, the gospel on the first Sunday of Lent lays out realistically what we are up against: pressures not to change for the better and to ignore our spiritual relationship to God and others. There are tempting forces that influence us to drift and wander from God instead of growing closer to Him (call that pull-away the Devil or whatever). However the Church doesn't just negatively leave us there facing opposition. She also places before us the great change that is possible if we climb the hill with Jesus: Transfiguration. The Transfiguration scene reveals the full divinity of Christ in glory. It is the forward plan and road map for Christian discipleship and Christian mission. But it takes the great effort of ascending the mountain. This upward pursuit is symbolic of the 'vision quest' or 'hero's journey' of life's meaning and its fulfillment or redemption. We call that 'heavenly bliss', the 'beatific vision' or 'glorious union with Christ in the Kingdom of God'. In the verse just before today's gospel reading begins, (Luke 9:27) Jesus had said, "Truly I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see the kingdom of God." The very next verse (28) opens the Transfiguration scene, and reads "About eight days after he said this, he took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray." To me, 'Eight days' means just a week later. Not forty days, but only eight days and those apostles see great change! The journey up the mount with Jesus and the 'glorious vision' are meant to 'spur' the apostles onward toward the Kingdom. Jesus actually gives a glimpse of 'heaven' to Peter, James and John. Why them? Well they are the first leaders of Jesus' Church, as we hear St Paul say in Galatians 2:9, that Cephas-Peter, James and John are 'esteemed pillars of the Church'. The word 'pillar' reflects Jesus' calling Peter 'Rock' upon which His church would be built (Matthew 16:18). So Jesus is strengthening His first Church leaders by sharing this Transfiguration event with them. He is preparing and heartening them for the mission work of His Kingdom. On a smaller scale Jesus did this with all of his apostles time after time, when he called them aside to experience quiet with Him in prayer. You can refer to these places in Luke 6:12, 9:18, 9:28, 11:1-4 and 22:39-40. Jesus often drew away from crowds alone and with His apostles to commune with the Father, find rest in His divinity and share this composure with His friends. In Lent, Jesus invites us to share in this experience of His presence through our deepened prayer and taking extra time to reflect upon and know God in our lives. But creating the space and setting the time for our prayer communion with God takes effort. It may even be quite challenging when we consider all the demands and stresses that confront us every

Yet, Lent calls us to plough through the distractions and obstacles of this world, to resist anything that impedes or opposes our growing closer to God. Many things, people or situations bombard our time and peace. But we need to keep focused upon Jesus and His promise of Transfiguration. The mountain climb is what comes before us experiencing the peace and glory of the Transfiguration. But don't let obstacles impede your growth. As the Roman Philosopher Marcus Aurelius said, "An impediment to action advances the action. What stands in the way becomes the way." Or a little more recently in history, the music group Bush sings, "The only way out is through!" Jesus was clear in warning us that pressures would pull us away from God. In Luke 17:1 he says, "Temptations inevitably will come". And in Luke 22:31, Jesus even says "Satan seeks to sift you all like wheat" to lead us away from God. So, we have to maintain 'focus' and 'discipline' to experience lasting change and 'transfiguration'.

But the Transfiguration of Jesus can be the overcoming influence if we keep our eyes on Jesus and "compete well for the faith" (1 Timothy 6:12 'fight the good fight'). Or again St Paul challenges us to "run so as to win" (1 Corinthians 9:24). And the letter to the Hebrews advises us to, "Strive therefore, to enter into that rest (of Christ)" (4:11). So Lent invites us to elevate our hearts and our conduct through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, to lift our minds to Christ. Our spiritual exercises will take us up the mountain of glory. Colossians 3:1 says "Seek what is above!"
