Village Board of Trustees Meeting

The Strasburg Village Board of Trustees met on March 16, 2026, at the Strasburg Community Center. Village President Cinda Held called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with all reciting the "Pledge of Allegiance."

In attendance were Trustees Robert Anderson, Jack Clark, Kristina Moore, Ian Kinkley, and Josh Storm, Village President Cinda Held, Village Attorney Dustin Probst, Clerk Linda Oakley, Fiscal Clerk Lisa Rincker, Kenny Fleek from Milano & Grunloh, Ed Held, and Gary Kull. Trustee Dawn Schlechte was absent.

Attorney Probst noted that he is waiting to hear on the title work for the Seamless ground purchase. As soon as it is received, a closing date will be set.

Kenny Fleek, Milano & Grunloh, presented information on the school sewer project and sewer lagoon project. Demolition of the old treatment plant will happen after the ground is firm enough to prevent damage. . Village Lagoon – a leak was found in the berm, the cause was located and remediated. All aeration header piping has been installed. Rip Rap has been installed. Aeration disks to be installed and startup to begin on the 8<sup>th</sup> of April. Change Order #8 requesting extension of the completion date was presented. **Motion** by Trustee Kinkley to approve Change Order #8 was seconded by Trustee Clark. Motion voted on and carried. Anderson – yea; Clark – yea; Kinkley – yea; Moore – yea; Schlechte – absent; Storm – yea.

Kennedy Kull, Claire Von Behrens and Jim Weiss told the board that they are planning to hold a Memorial Day Program on Monday, May 25 at 11:00 AM. This year they will be recognizing members of the National Guard. They requested permission from the board to close the street in front of the Veterans' Memorial from noon on Sunday, May 24 until after the ceremony. If inclement weather, they would like to use either the Community Center or the new pavilion. **Motion** by Trustee Moore to close the road and allow use of the Community Center or new pavilion was seconded by Trustee Anderson. Motion voted on by voice vote and carried unanimously.

Ms. Kull, Ms. Von Behren and Mr. Weiss left the meeting.

**Motion** by Trustee Moore to approve the routine business items was seconded by Trustee Storm. Motion voted on and carried by voice vote.

Attorney Probst left the meeting at 7:00 PM.

EJ's report noted that odor issues at the lagoon are expected to subside once construction is complete. Throughout this period, the contractor remains responsible for all plant discharges.

**Motion** by Trustee Kinkley to approve the MFT Resolution for 2026 was seconded by Trustee Clark. Motion voted on and carried. Anderson – yea; Clark – yea; Kinkley – yea; Moore – yea; Schlechte – absent; Storm – yea.

Trustee Moore is working on a Foundation Grant for two ADA compliant swings and pea gravel for the playground.

Consensus to approve the building permit for Dylan Meadows for the construction of a new home at 1 York Drive.

Trustees requested that President Held get quotes on the floor and painting for renovation of the Community Center for next year's budget.

**Motion** by Trustee Anderson to donate \$3,000 towards the fireworks for the 250<sup>th</sup> Celebration on July 5<sup>th</sup> was seconded by Trustee Storm. Motion voted on and carried. Anderson – yea; Clark – yea; Kinkley – yea; Moore – yea; Schlechte – absent; Storm – yea.

Discussion held on possible activities for the 250<sup>th</sup> Celebration. Trustee Storm will check on the price of blow-ups.

Trustee Kinkley is getting ideas on how to expand the Frisbee Golf to 9 holes once the Seamless property is purchased.

Gary Kull had submitted a grant to the Lumpkin Foundation for landscaping and drainage. Unfortunately, our grant was not accepted. However, the bid from Lake Sara Landscapes for landscaping was presented. The information for the bid on the drainage was not submitted to the village. Discussion held regarding seeding part of the ground and finishing the rest in the fall as grass grows better in the fall.

President Held presented a Community Survey Draft for board members to consider asking community members for ideas for a 5-10 year plan. She requested that board members come back next month with ideas.

Mr. Kull inquired if there would be cabinets in the new kitchen. That decision will be made once we see how much room there is.

Trustees asked who will have access to the building? That has yet to be determined.

Clerk Oakley will check with Peters Building to see if something can be attached to the outside faucet to make a drinking faucet.

No further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:35 PM.
