ne definition for Love can be found in 1 Corinthians 13. Read this chapter every day for a deeper understanding. Other scriptures are found in John 3:16; Romans 5:5-8; Jeremiah 31:3; Ephesians 4:2, 3; Romans 12:9, 10, to name a few.

"If I had the gift of being able to speak in other languages without learning them, and could speak in every language there is in all of heaven and in earth, but didn't love others, I would only be making noise. If I had the gift of prophecy and knew all about what is going to happen in the future, knew everything about everything, but didn't love others, what good would it do? Even if I had the gift of faith so that I could speak to a mountain and make it move, I would still be worth nothing at all without love. If I gave everything I have to the poor people, and if I were burned alive for preaching the Gospel but didn't love others, it would be of no valve whatever. Love is very patient and kind, never jealous or envious, never boastful or proud, never haughty or selfish or rude. Love does not demand its own way. It is not irritable or touchy. It does not hold grudges and will hardly even notice when others do it wrong. It is never glad about injustice, but rejoices whenever truth wins out. If you love someone you will be loyal to him no matter what the cost. You will always believe in him, always expect the best of him and always stand your ground in defending him. All special gifts and powers from God will someday come to an end, but love goes on forever. There are three things that remain faith, hope, and love and the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians 13:1-8, 13) The Living Bible.

Some signs that will help you recognize LOVE in action and will help you begin to cultivate the Fruit of LOVE in yourself: showing concern for others, obeying God's commandments, saving kind words, helping someone with their homework, obeying parents, being patient, being loyal to a friend or to your faith not irritated easily, not envious, not boastful, reading to a small child, visiting the convalescent homes, visiting the sick and shut-ins, sending cards to the sick and shut-ins, hello by serving meals, forgiving someone, doing good deeds, encouraging others, helping an elderly person, being unselfish and sharing with others, being happy when the truth is revealed, letting others get the praise, not rude, not jealous, not proud, reading to an elderly person, visiting the prisons, calling the sick and shut-ins, going on errands cheerfully, helping someone understand God's word. 

#### Epiphany (January 5 - March 5, 2019)

**Epiphany** or The Season After Epiphany (4-9 Sundays) is a time for remembering the various times and ways Jesus was revealed to humans, particularly to the Gentiles (non-Jews) through the Magi (Wise Men) who represented other nationalities. It is a reminder of the universality of Jesus, the Savior of persons in every land. The first Sunday after Epiphany Day (January 6) is known as Baptism of the Lord referring to 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-22, and John 1:29-34. This is an excellent time for baptism and renewal of the baptismal covenant. Appropriate symbols are water, the baptismal shell or font, a descending dove, and a cross standing in water. The emphasis for the remainder of the season is on the beginning of Jesus' ministry, the miracles performed, and Jesus' works and teachings.

**Color**: Green is symbolic of the freshness of nature, hope, life, and growth.

**Devotional Reading:** Psalm 119:65-72

Scripture: Philippians 2:1-11

#### **EXALT!**

Invocation: Speak Lord so that we hear from heaven. Speak through Your word, our teacher, and to each of us. Center our thoughts on You. During this lesson and in the week to follow, let the Holy Ghost energize our spirits for your purpose. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Declaration: Philippians 2:1-11

<sup>1</sup> If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, <sup>2</sup> make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard other as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup>Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death- even death on the cross.

<sup>9</sup> Therefore God also highly

exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

**Affirmation:** We aspire to serve others by following Jesus' example of humility and sacrifice!

#### **ENGAGE**

Personal interests and selfish ambitions can lead to controversies that threaten our relationships. How can people overcome their divisiveness? Paul commends the example of Christ, who humbly emptied Himself in order to serve God and others through His sacrifice. Discuss leaders you admire in both society and the church who are willing to be humble and serve. How do Jesus' word apply: Those who would be great among you must first be your servants (Matthew 20:26-27)? How would you describe a "servant leader"? Are you amazed when someone of high standing is willing to get her or his hands dirty in service? Give examples of ones you have seen. Consider the example of Pope Francis washing the feet of 8 men and four women of different religions and countries. (See the story online - March 24, 2016.) what was the Pope trying to reflect in his actions?

#### **EDUCATE**

Philippians 2:1-4: Paul writes

this letter to the Philippians form his Roman imprisonment, and instead of being comforted and encouraged by the church there in Philippi, he has to try to comfort and encourage them in the midst of their squabbles and infighting. In doing so, he reminds them of what they have received from Christ and of the example Christ has set for them. He lifts up unity, love, compassion, comfort, humility, which they must emulate and show also among themselves. "Selflessness," and not the selfishness which their divisiveness is reflecting, is what Paul has to convince them to display by valuing others above themselves, and looking after the interest of others rather than their own.

Philippians 2:1-11: Verses 6-11 have been called "the Philippian hymn." it has been compared to other hymns or hymn-like passages in the New Testament such as John 1:1-18: Colossians 1:15-20: 1 Peter 3:18-22, and Hebrews 1:1-4. These texts highlight Christ's divinity and preexistence, His role in creation, painful death, resurrection and exaltation. Paul cites the poem as an encouragement to the bickering church members to imitate the humility of Christ among themselves, thus showing to what great length Christ humbled Himself from His high position with God in order to play a servant role among us all for the sake of our redemption. The text presents Christ's two natures ("in the form of God" and "taking the form of a slave") as a paradox. The designation "kenotic theology"

derives from verse 7. Christ "emptied" (ekenosen) Himself, but just welfare of others first. "Survival what that emptying entailed is a matter of great theological debate. For instance, it is debated whether it was an emptying of Himself of His divinity or what? Confession is an important biblical theme. The confession Paul speaks of here is not the admission of guilt, but rather the confession or affirmation of the lordship of Christ.

#### **ELEVATE**

As Christians, we celebrate the love that inspired Jesus to take on the form of a slave to secure our salvation, but it is a struggle for us to have the attitude of Christ. It is something we have to grow into daily. We confess that God has come to us in Christ, even though we don't fully understand how this mystery is possible. It is accepted on faith, and as the song says, "We Shall Understand It Better By and By." And we understand a little better day by day and year by year. Though Christians accept Christ's humility as a model for their lives, they grow in the ability to place the needs of others before their own. It is our natural

tendency to look to our own interests first and not to put the interests and dictates that we do! But the gospel turns that order of life upside down. Having received God's promise that He will always supply what we need and receiving the fullness of His grace through Jesus' self-giving death, we are freed from the need to protect our own interests and empowered to pursue the good of others" (Standard Lesson Commentary 2018-2019, p.188).

Discuss ways you may better use your divine gifts and privileges to serve others. Make a list of things you will try to do in order to place the need of others above your own in the future; share this with other members of the group. Design a prayer to God thanking God for the self-sacrificial gift of Jesus, repenting for not following Jesus' example, and asking for the power and resolve to follow the model of Christ. List the names of persons in your congregation or in your surrounding community or experience who do model their lives on the pattern of the self-sacrificial example of Christ. How do you think they manage to do this?

#### I THINK:

- Compare and contrast the Philippian hymn with the Christ Colossians 1:15-20.
- Discuss the self-contradictory nature of this statement, "I'm trying to develop a sense of humility I can be proud of."
- Note places in the Gospels where Jesus taught about serving others or demonstrated an example of humble service. How do these passages shed light on the hymn in Philippians 2? Discuss what it means to "be of the same mind" with other believers (verse 2). Does this mean Christians should all think alike? If not, what does it mean? How is this quality related to humble servanthood?

**VERSE OF THE WEEK: In humility,** regard others as better than yourselves. Philippians 2:3

#### celebrate God's **New Testament** Covenant.

The Sabbath is a holy day established by God. The word Sabbath means "rest." God sanctified the 7" day of the week, Saturday as the Sabbath, and declared it holy unto you. (Genesis 2:2; Exodus 20:8-11). God did not make a gentle suggestion for His people, the Israelites to rest from their own labors; instead, He mandated it.

#### The Sabbath Has Two Purposes:

- 1. The Sabbath is a day commanded the Jews to rest from their own secular labors.
- 2. It is the 7<sup>th</sup> day of each week set aside to remember all that God has done for His people and to worship and praise Him for it.

The Omnipotent, Omniscient, and Omnipresent God set aside a day out of each week for his people and sanctified it as holy. He knew humankind needed a day out of each week to relinquish our hurried, bustled lives of rushing and hustling. Therefore, He mandated this day for praise, worship, and thanksgiving to Him, so He could refresh and renew our spirits. Only God can make us holy, because He is holy and He said in His Word:" Be ye holy as I am holy." Read: Leviticus 11:45- "I am the Lord who brought you up out of Egypt to be your God; therefore, be holy as I am holy."

1 Peter 1:15-16- But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; v-16-For it is written: Be holy for I am holy.

#### The Sabbath Is A Sign Between God And Man:

#### Read:

- Exodus 31:13-18
- Isaiah 59:13-14

**Question:** What is the punishment for desecrating the Sabbath?

Further Study of the Old Testament Relating to This Sabbath Lesson:

Exodus 31:12-18

- Leviticus 19:3; 30
- Ezekiel 20:12-20
- Isaiah 1:13; 58: 13-14;
- Isaiah 66: 23-24

Later in Old Testament times, the Jewish elders added their traditions to the simple Sabbath Law; so much so, that the law became burdensome and even foolish for the people. Then, in the New Testament, Jesus came teaching against the Jewish elders and leader's traditions, but not against God's established Sabbath Law.

"New- moons" and "Sabbaths" refer to monthly offerings (Numbers 28:11-4) and weekly and special annual Sabbaths on the Day of Atonement and Feast of Tabernacles Leviticus 16:31; 23, 34, and 39).

The people worshipped but did not A Shadow of God's Reality: feel sorry for their sins; so they continued offering sacrifices for forgiveness. But gifts and sacrifices mean nothing to God, when they come from someone with a corrupt heart.

Sacrifices were to be an outward sign of their inward faith in God. Many people today are like the Israelites of old, who placed more importance on the rituals of their religion than on the God they worshipped.

Now, to answer the question asked in the lesson topic, Why Is Sunday Sacred?

After the ascension of Jesus Christ, His disciples met on the ascension of Jesus Christ, his disciples met on the first day of each week for rest, praise and worship. The Jews celebrated both Sabbaths for awhile, but the Gentile Christians having never kept any such day before, celebrated only Sunday, the first day of the week was the day the New 'Testament Christians observed as the day Christ arose. Therefore, Sunday observance came into the church during "New Testament" times.

The Law written in Exodus 24:31 and Leviticus 19:9-10 prevented farmers from becoming greedy and ignoring God on the Sabbath, and these laws also protected laborers from being overworked. Deuteronomy 23:25 made provisions for travelers and for the poor among the people.

However, Jesus Christ came fulfilling the Prophets and the Law.

Question: Should we observe Saturday worship instead of Sunday?

The Law served as a shadow of the reality of things to come in the person of Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son.

eat." This year, the fast will consist of abstaining from food. In other words, you are fasting if you are not eating food.

Fasting does not change or impress God. Fasting changes us. Through fasting, Christians are empowered to discipline their daily relationship with the Lord.

### B. WHY FAST? WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

- 1. Helps Christians become more sensitive to the Holy Spirit;
- Presents the opportunity for you to spend more time waiting on the Lord;
- 3. Intensifies your prayer life;
- 4. Aids in removing unbelief;
- 5. Breaks yokes of bondage;
- Sharpens your intellect, skill, discernment, and understanding;
- 7. Aids in clarity of spiritual hearing when guidance or a decision is needed from the Holy Spirit;
- Hastens emotional, spiritual, financial and physical healing for both individuals and the community;
- 9. Fosters personal discipline;
- Focuses you on the source, God, the Supply, and Supplier of your benefits and blessings;
- Demonstrates (to yourself) an act of scriptural obedience

Prayerfully, each member will participate in the Church Family Fast. Please consult your physician about your fasting if you:

- 1. Are on prescribe medication;
- 2. Pregnant;
- 3. You are under a doctor's care;
- 4. You have experienced illness on a previous fast;
- 5. Or you do not normally eat anyway.

Your physician's order takes precedence over this fast! Follow your physicians orders!!!

## D. What are we praying about during the fast?

**Prayer Petitions:** 

• Spiritual growth (healing and wholeness)

- Physical Healing & Prosperity blessings
- Numerical church growth (souls for the kingdom)
- Financial growth (tithes & offerings)

### E. Two types of fasting Proclaimed & Personal

#### 1. Proclaimed fast

1 Chronicles 20; Jehoshaphat proclaimed a fast in fear of an attack on Judah. A proclaimed fast will put you in position to hear from God to receive guidance for a specific situation.

#### 2. Personal fast

Is not conspicuous. Purpose of fasting is to shut-off the influence of our flesh in order to be in tune with the Spirit.

- Fasting helps us to receive from God - but does not necessary push God to action - for the problem is not with God - the problem is with us.
- Rewards of fasting Matthew 6:16-18
- Other Scripture: The fast that God has chosen Isaiah 58

### 10 PRACTICAL GUIDELINES ON FASTING

BY CHARLES NG OF SINGAPORE

- 1. Enter into fasting with a positive faith. If you are determined to seek God diligently by fasting, you have a Scriptural right to expect that God will reward you. In Matthew 6:18, Jesus promises to every believer who fasts correctly: "your father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."
- Do not wait for an emergency to drive you to fast. It is better to begin fasting when you are spiritually up than down. The law of progress in God's Kingdom is from "strength to strength" (Ps. 84:7), "from faith to faith" (Rom. 1:17), and from "glory to glory" (2Cor. 3:18).
- Do not set for yourself too long a period of fasting. If you are fasting

for the first time, begin by omitting one or two meals. Then, move on to longer periods such as a day or two. It is better to begin with a short period and achieving it than to do a long period of fasting and not achieving it.

- During your period of fasting, feed on God's Word, the Bible. Where possible, read a portion of Scripture before each period of prayer. The Psalms are especially helpful.
- 5. Avoid boastfulness—apart from special periods of prayer, your life should be as normal as possible.
- 6. Check on your motives each time you fast. Take time to read Isaiah 58.
- 7. If you are on regular medication or suffer from diabetes or TB, it is wise to obtain medical advice before entering into any fast.
- 8. As you enter fast, you might suffer discomfort, unpleasant physical symptoms such as dizziness or nausea. Do not be deterred. Go through with the fast as planned. After the first day or two, these unpleasant physical reactions usually subside.
- Remember that hunger is purely a matter of habit. If you hold out, the sensation of hunger will go away. Sometimes you can fool your stomach by drinking a glass of water instead of snacking.
- 10. Guard against constipation.

  Before and after fasting, choose meals that will help you in this respect such as fresh fruits, fruit juices, dried figs, prunes, apricots, or oatmeal.

**Total Fast:** Abstaining from solid foods for 24 hours. Taking only water.

**Partial fast:** Abstaining from solid foods for an extended part of the day, e.g. from 7:00 am until 7:00 PM. Taking only water.

**1 Meal Fast:** Sacrificing one full meal a day, eg. Abstaining from lunch.

**Daniel Fast:** Abstaining from meals and other delicacies. Taking only small portions of fresh vegetables, fruit and juices.

#### The Daniel Fast

- The Daniel Fast involves a spiritual commitment to God.
   "Daniel proposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the Kings delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank." (Daniel 1: 8)
- Faith is foundational to the Daniel Fast. "Then I set my face toward my God to make request by prayer and supplications, with fasting" (Daniel. 9:30 "However, this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting" (Matthew 17: 21)
- Fast and yield yourself to God as a servant. Daniel said, "as you see fit, deal with your servants" (Daniel 1:13)
- Schedule your prayer / and end with thanksgiving Daniel "kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks" (Daniel 6: 10)
- Begin with confession, (repentance), dedication, and prayer "Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me, and know my anxieties; And see if there is any wicked way in me, And lead me in the way of everlasting" (Psalm 39: 23-24)

Remember: The Daniel Fast will lead to spiritual insight. "... to these young men God gave knowledge" (Daniel 1: 17)

Our body is designed to heal

itself. When a disease enters our body from bad dietary habits or from the outside. our bodies begin to fight it. Doctors. surgery, or medicines are most often designed to remove the source of the problem, but the healing is done by the body itself. Many common diseases are easily prevented with basic good nutrition and exercise habits.

#### STEP ONE: BE SPECIFIC

Daniel was not vague in his objection to the Babylonian diet. He defined the problem immediately.

- 1. The king's food was against dietary laws.
- 2. Daniel and his friends had vowed against wine.
- 3. The king's food had been offered up to idols/demons.

### STEP TWO: FAST AS A SPIRITUAL COMMITMENT

The Daniel Fast involves a spiritual commitment to God. "Daniel proposed in his heart that lie \would not defile himself' (Dan. 1:8).

## STEP THREE: REFLECT INNER DESIRE BY OUTER DISCIPLINE

Many people have an inner desire for better health, but they can't discipline themselves to avoid junk food, and other foods that were not good for health. The physical health you seek from God may be more than an answer to prayer. Your physical health may be linked to any of the following factors:

- A. Your food choices.
- B. The level of your spiritual commitment as reflected in constant prayer during the fast.
- C. Your time commitment. If you determine to fast for a certain time, keep it. For example. if you determine to fast 10 days. don't stop on Day 9
- D. Your testimony commitment. Your fast is a statement of faith to God that you want Him to heal your body.

#### **Daniel Fast Soup**

1/4 cup of extra virgin olive oil

1ea large onion, diced

2ea 10oz bag Shredded carrots

2ea stalks celery, diced

4ea medium potatoes, diced

2ea 24oz frozen cut Green Beans

12 cups of water (96 oz)

3ea 32-ounce of Organic vegetable broth. low sodium (Pacific Natural Foods)

2ea 16-ounce bag of fresh coleslaw

2ea 16-ounce can of Organic diced tomato (Muir Glen)

2ea 16-ounce bag of frozen chopped spinach,

2ea 16-ounce bag of frozen sliced zucchini

4ea 16 -ounce cans of Organic Dark kidney beans (Nature's Promise), drained & rinse

1. In 16-quart Dutch oven or large saucepot over medium heat, in hot extra virgin olive oil, cook onion, carrots, celery, potatoes and green beans until vegetables are lightly browned, about 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.

2. Add water, Organic vegetable broth, tomatoes with their liquid, spinach, zucchini, salt (optional), over high heat, heat to boiling, stirring to break up tomatoes.

- 3. Reduce heat to low; cover; simmer 30 minutes or until all the vegetables are very tender, stirring occasionally; do not overcook.
- 4. Stir in beans; cook 15 minutes longer or just until the soup is slightly thickened.
- 5. Turn off heat and add coleslaw and let sit on burner for 10 minutes

What ever happened to Christmas? What ever happened to the Christ of Christmas? Long ago there was no room in the inn. Is there any room for Him in today's celebration? Are little children ever told about Him?

What ever happen to the birth of the Saviour? Should it even be mentioned? Was it a significant event? Has it been a giant mistake that our calendars mark His birth as the starting point, and that His birth divides all of this world's history into B.C. (before Christ) and A.D. (anno Domni, in the year of the Lord)?

In the past we were concerned about the secularization of the Christmas holiday and we urged people to keep Christ in Christmas. Now it seems we have even lost Christmas! Look at the decorations people put up on their lawns: blown up snowmen, beautifully lighted reindeer, Santa Claus in all kinds of shapes and sizes, etc. Would children understand Antiochus Epiphanes, in 164 B.C.

the true meaning of Christmas if their knowledge of this day came only from observing the holiday decorations and all the Santa paraphernalia?

We observe a holiday at the beginning of every year and people are not ashamed of it. They say, "Happy New Year!" They don't say, "Happy Holiday!" They understand exactly what the holiday is all about and they have no problem celebrating the coming of a new year. Why are we embarrassed to celebrate the coming of the Saviour into the world? "This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptation that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15).

One might object: "If we make too much of Christmas we might offend our Jewish friends and we might offend the Muslims and we might offend the atheists." When our Jewish friends celebrate Hanukkah, for example, they are celebrating their deliverance from a brutal tyrant, King

They have every right to celebrate this remarkable event and the courage of Judas Maccabeus and other heroes of that day. Indeed, most of the Jewish holy days (Passover, Day of Atonement, etc.) have their basis in the Bible and are highly instructive.

Muslims observe their holy days and are neither ashamed of them nor embarrassed by them. In our country they have a right to do so, and that right should be respected (even though in nearly all Muslim countries religious freedom is unheard of and such rights are rarely if ever given to Christians). Do not Christians have a right to celebrate the birth of the Saviour, the time when God became a man? Or should we only do so secretly, behind closed doors without anyone finding out what it is or Who it is we are celebrating?

Atheists don't have any holidays to celebrate their unbelief. There is little motivation to hold festivities in honor of a world view in which man finds

Malachi 3:10 instructs, "Bring ye all tithes into the storehouse," By giving a tithe or more, I can demonstrate in a tangible way my obedience to God.

When I tithe I acknowledge a relationship with God. This relationship expresses itself through faithfulness in living and giving. Giving a tithe is a constant reminder that God is owner and I am his manager. The Psalmist speaks of this special relationship: "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and they dwell therein." (Psalm 24:1). I can acknowledge His ownership and my stewardship responsibility every time I give a tithe to my church.

When I tithe I enhance the ministry of my church. Most ministries of the church are supported by member's

gifts. Tithing, therefore, has a practical value as a systematic means of providing financial support to help my church accomplish its mission. When my church is supported by committed tithes, it can more adequately fund its ever growing list of ministries which include preaching the Word, winning the lost, teaching the saved, and extending its witness to the ends of this earth.

When I tithe I witness around the world. A conservative estimate is more than 125 million people in the United States are unsaved and 66 percent of the world's population doesn't know Christ as their personal Savior (Home Mission Board). Christ has commissioned the church to global discipleship. I can witness far beyond my neighborhood to 120 countries by giving a tithe or more to my church each week.

When I tithe I reflect my priorities. Jesus admonished his followers to "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness." (Matthew 6:33). Operating with a proper sense of priorities is one of the most difficult tasks. By setting aside at least the first tenth of my income for my church, I establish a pattern for giving and testify to God's priority in my heart.

When I tithe I exercise my faith in God. The decision to tithe, or not to tithe, is more likely related to faith than economics. Like other important life making decisions, tithing involves an act of faith. The scriptures abound with examples of giving by faith. Abraham giving his tithes; the widow giving all she had. Tithing can help me and others develop a greater faith in the adequacy and faithfulness of God to grow in giving.

#### **Imagine**

Imagine for a moment that you plan to take a vacation trip to some far-away place. Because of the distance and the complex nature of your expectations for this trip, it takes you years of planning and sacrifices to come up with what appears to be your life-time of savings and effort just for this one trip. From all indications you are aware that you will need every available support to get through this trip. For starters, you are aware that at certain portions of the journey, your skills will be challenged. You may have to get on your knees in some places. You will be challenged to crawl, to run, to walk and even where possible, to swim and wade in order to traverse parts of this journey.

Nothing has been overlooked. Not because you have the abundance of riches and resources. On the contrary, it is a trip that has, effectively and absolutely tested your resolve, your readiness and your worth as a bona fide member of your community. Over the years you've been aware of all the various and sundry individuals who have successfully undertaken this trip – sort of the vacation of all vacations. Yet it is not for the faint of heart, it is the proverbial bitter pill that cures your ailment but can only be taken by the individual and not by surrogates.

Now, imagine for the second time. Actually, the last time; that, on the morning of your departure, when you have completed all the necessary precautions of securing your home, securing your vehicle, and your mail, that you receive a text message that says that - you are to come out and meet a limousine with a dedicated chauffeur, who has been instructed to pick you up from your door step and to ensure that you start this trip with virtually none of the encumbrances that many have had to deal with.

With utter disbelief, you frantically check the text message, and inspect the mobile devise to make sure it is what it is supposed to be. It turns out to be just as it has always been. Your next action is to look outside to confirm what you've been instructed to do. ### You Are Stronger Than You Think

Scarcely any joy equals this realization: You have it in you to meet all your responsivities. This consciousness contributes immeasurably to high spirits and happiness. It is difficult to face each day with a sense of inability and weakness. With such an attitude, life seems too much, and discouragement sets in.

Here is the antidote for such a dismal feeling:

Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you. Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand. Isaiah 41:10

This is a most important promise God makes to us. No matter how overwhelming your problems, you need have no fear. You are not to let anything dismay you, for God says He will strengthen and help you. In fact, He promises He will hold you up and make you adequate for any situation.

Accept this great fact. Hold this verse strongly in your consciousness until it sends its rugged courage throughout your entire life.

#### **OUT OF CONTEXT**

READ: John 20:13-16

She turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus.

John 20:14

As I queued up to board my flight, someone tapped my shoulder. I turned and received a warm greeting. "Elisa! Do you remember me? It's Joan!" my mind flipped through various "Joans" I'd known, but I couldn't place her. Was she a previous neighbor? A past coworker? Oh dear...I didn't know.

Sensing my struggle, Joan responded, "Elisa, we knew each other in high school." A memory rose: Friday night football games, cheering from the stands. Once the context was clarified, I recognized Joan.

After Jesus's death, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early in the morning and found the stone rolled away and His body gone (John 20:1-2). She ran to get Peter and John, who returned with her to find the tomb empty (VV. 3-10). But Mary lingered outside in her grief (v. 11). When Jesus appeared there, "she did not realize that it was Jesus" (V. 14), thinking He

was the gardener (V. 15).

How could she have not recognized Jesus? Was His resurrected body so changed that it was difficult to recognize Him? Did her grief blind her to His identity? Or, perhaps, like me, was it because Jesus was "out of context," alive in the garden instead of dead in the tomb, that she didn't recognize Him?

How might we too miss Jesus when He comes into our days -during prayer or Bible reading, or by simply whispering in our hearts? -Elisa Morgan

Dear God, give us eyes to see Jesus, however He comes-in a familiar context or surprising us in an unexpected one.
