

A Note from Pastor Toni

How things have changed in a month! Who could have ever known that our world would be in complete chaos and turmoil because of an unprecedented event. The medical world uses the word, '*novel*', for such an event. This is a <u>novel</u> <u>corona virus</u> that has demanded all of our attention; more than anything else l've seen in my lifetime. We are all facing drastic if not dramatic changes in our daily routine.

Many of us are home from work and working from home. Many of us are considered "high risk" because of health issues that can render us severely sick if we contract this virus. Many of us are beginning to get edgy, depressed, or angry because we feel confined and our freedom has been taken away.

I admit that I have had those thoughts periodically in the past couple of days.

It brought to mind a quote that I have often said to myself out loud since Bill passed away. It's a quote spoken by Victor Frankl, who was an Austrian neurologist and psychiatrist, as well as a Holocaust survivor. Frankl said this: "The last of one's freedoms is to choose one's attitude in any given circumstance." My second favorite morsel of wisdom said by Frankl is this: "When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves." To parallel these statements with scripture the

To parallel these statements with scripture the Apostle Paul teaches us in

1 Thess. 5:16-18, *"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for*

this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." **Ps. 7:17** reminds us to "...give to the Lord the thanks due to His righteousness, and sing praise to the name of the Lord, Most High!' And in **1 John 4:4** we are reminded about who we are in Christ, which alone ought to help us change our attitudes! "Little children (COGPOW's) you are from God and have overcome them, for He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world!" And finally Paul reminds us in **Rom. 12:2-3**, "Therefore, do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will."

"When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves!!" So, your challenge in our current situation is to challenge yourself to be more like Jesus than you have ever been before. You can be the voice of reason, joy, possibility, truth, love, grace and hope!

The writer of Hebrews encourages us to "...not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another and all the more as we see the day approaching." **Heb. 10:25**

The 'day' the writer was referring to was the day of Christ's return. I would like to suggest that 'the day' for us is the day when we can look back and remember how our attitudes affected others during the time of the novel corona virus. Just maybe, the way you are handling this could be the catalyst for someone coming to Christ. Please stay connected during this time as a faith community. Touch base with those who live alone or are struggling with illness. Be a voice of strength and compassion, listen more than usual and pray with others when you can.

And take care of yourselves. Take really good care of yourselves. The first Sunday we are able to meet again in our house of worship will be our official Easter! It is my sincere hope and belief that this column will be full of things in our May Bridge.


Saints Alive events are open to anyone 55 or older, or anyone who knows someone 55 or older!





Congregational Care Report to LT March, 2020 Sarah Frey

Due to the COVID-19 advent and the closing of the church facility, most people on our address list have been contacted by phone to determine how they are doing and what assistance they may need. Those people thought to be most vulnerable and dependent were called first. The response to "telecare" has been amazing. This has been an opportunity to connect with "regulars" as well as with people that we have not seen in our assembly for a long time and who have questions and concerns about various things. The latter group appreciated being connected once again to the church.

To help people to connect with church on Facebook, Anita Lantz and I again called people who are not on the email list of the church. It was amazing how many of the non-email people either have Facebook or knew of a way they could become connected. People were very interested and excited about "having church" in their own homes. I hope we keep this option for worship beyond the current crisis.

Three people in our congregation have volunteered through Pastor Toni to do shopping, pharmaceutical deliveries and other errands for people who are staying in seclusion.

Doris Callison is now receiving meals in her home 3 times a week as she recovers from knee surgery. Anyone who would like to prepare a meal for her please call me at 842-4980.

A "Choose How You Will Serve" survey was prepared to be circulated to the congregation on March 15. That being the first Sunday we did not meet in the building, the surveys are waiting in a file folder for the proper time to be distributed.

The *Loving Each Other* bulletin insert is going out with the new weekly bulletin. Thank you, Michael, for the orchid colored title to continue the continuity. Getting information for this insert has been difficult for me. Please, please, please encourage people to participate in supplying things the congregation needs to know. Call me yourself with info early enough in the week so that I can seek permission to have things published.

I am open to suggestions from you about how we can expand congregational care—particularly during this season of many changes and increased anxiety.

From the Leadership Board April 2020...

Restricted Operations during Pandemic.

Even before the Governor's proclamation, your Leadership Board decided at a March 17 emergency meeting that to protect our congregants and employees the buildings would be locked and closed to all use through April 5. The Governor's proclamation effectively extends that until further notice. Only Pastor Toni, church employees, the Facilities crew, the Tailgater's crew and Leadership Board are permitted entry and then only for so long as is necessary to accomplish the task at hand (i.e. Michael is still in the office and Liesl is doing deep cleaning and sanitizing areas used). Kudos to Pastor Toni.

In the face of an unprecedented closure of our facilities Pastor Toni has conceived and executed a brilliant plan to serve by holding services and daily devotionals via Facebook. Lots of "hearts" being sent from viewers during the program. The Leadership Team and I'm sure all YUMC members commend Toni for her efforts in this regard. Thank you too to Leah Loughlin and Michael Bray for contributing their considerable technical and musical talents to make this work.

Continued Good Works during Pandemic.

Our ministries go on despite locked doors. The Tailgater's are still feeding people. I invite your attention to the April Congregational Care report for all the good work being done to support our members. Our youth ministry is keeping in touch so that they feel connected while observing social distancing. To minimize their financial stress, during the pandemic all church employees remain employed, including making preparations for when the doors open.

Finances.

The vast majority of financial support comes in Sunday gifts. Obviously without onsite services that opportunity to give has disappeared and, sorry to say, so have the gifts. My educated guess is that **giving is reduced 80% these last two weeks**. Although my estimate is that we have reduced expenses roughly 40%, our re serves will disappear in about four months.
