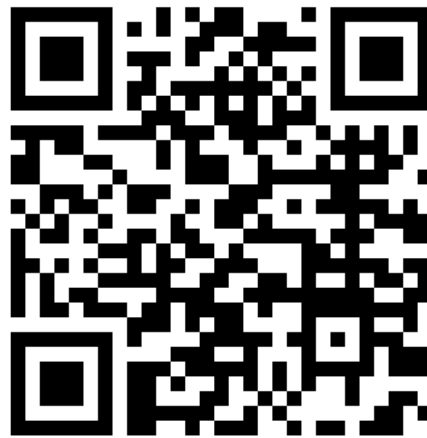

Frequently Asked Questions About the 1948 Tucker Automobile – Chuck Smith Part 1

How fast was the Tucker?

The Tucker sedan could travel 0-60 mph in 10 seconds, with a top speed clocked at over 120 mph.

Did the Tucker really use a helicopter engine?

Yes, the rear engine Tucker was powered by an Aircooled Motors Franklin ALV-335 166 HP 6 cylinder air cooled engine converted to water cooling. Preston Tucker liked the engines so well that he purchased Aircooled Motors in 1947.

How much did a Tucker cost new, and what are they worth today?

in 1948 the projected retail cost for the Tucker was \$2450, which made it less expensive than a Buick Roadmaster, Hudson Club Coupe, Frazer

Manhattan, Studebaker Commander, and several other models. Today a restored Tucker is valued between \$ 800,000 and \$ 1,000,000.

How many Tuckers were produced, and how many remain today?

Tucker Corporation produced a total of 51 cars- one 1947 prototype, and 50 pilot production cars in 1948 All 51 Tuckers have been accounted for with a total of 47 still remaining today.

What is a Tucker "Torpedo"?

Tucker Corporation used the name "Torpedo" in early promotional materials, but later dropped it. The Tucker '48 premiered June 19, 1947 at the Tucker plant before 5000 enthusiastic dealers, brokers, and members of the press. Many people still call the car a Tucker Torpedo.
