#### Surf Fish and Fresh Water Spring Schedule

June                  Saturday 15 th      Lake Silverwood

These trips are open to all club members and your guests. There is no cost involved other than beach parking and entry into the lakes.

Only game fish are eligible for the five fish jack pot entry. The total weight of up to five fish will be your entry. Surf fish only Corbina, Perch and Halibut. No Sharks or Rays. Fresh water Trout, Small Mouth Bass, Large Mouth Bass, Stripers and Cat Fish. No Carp or Gold Fish. You can use either natural or artificial baits.

Start any time after the lakes open or 7:00 am for surf fishing. We usually fish the lakes until 2:00 pm and surf fish until noon or until high tide.

If you are interested in going on these outings and have never been before, let me know and if there is enough interest, we can have a Saturday morning get together to discuss tackle and techniques.

Remember, everyone is welcome to participate. That means bring your kids, grand kids, great grand kids, friends and neighbors.

All of the lakes have boat launching, boat rentals, shore fishing as well as float tube and kayak access. One last note, if you are a boater bring a non-boater member with you.

Dick Guiliani and Don Merrill landed the only calicos with don's being biggest. The trip was mostly filled out by white fish., with Joel Tureaud catching one in excess of 4 pounds. Joel won the money while Don took home the hat. Congratulations.

We spent the day running around Santa Cruz and looking at areas close to Anacapa Island on a picky bite in the afternoon. The rockfish were small, but the whitefish bite remained consistent all day. I believe all had a good time and we beat the rains back in. Coming back the sea was like glass very smooth and inviting.
