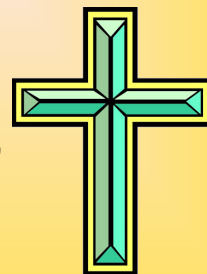
Catechism for Life

Beloit Learning and Activities Center

The new Beloit Learning and Activities Center is offering special programs to help Beloit School District students. The activities will include assistance with online learning and homework, music lessons, and art lessons, along with encouragement for kids to interact with their friends and fellow students.

The programs are being led and staffed by a group of volunteers willing to work with these kids about 1-2 hours per week. They're concerned about the educational progress that has been stalled or lost, and the lack of normal socialization that is the result of the long-term closure of in-person learning in the last year. The volunteers include an array of people with a variety of skills.

The programs will be housed in the classrooms of St. John's Lutheran School at 1000 Bluff St. in Beloit.

In keeping with State, County, and Local demands, all of the social distancing, mask, and hand sanitizer requirements will be followed.

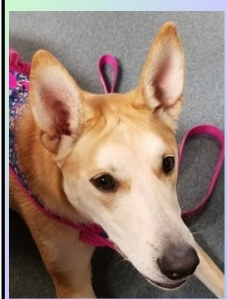

and being remembered.

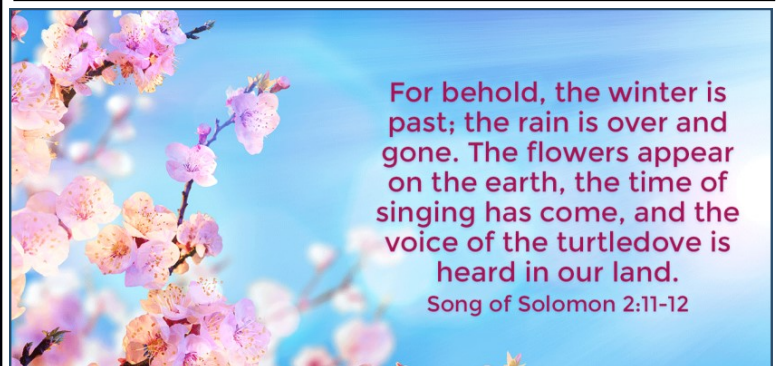

LCMS NATIONAL
CONVENTION
DELAYED
FOR ONE YEAR TO 2023

As many of you know, the Synod had asked its congregations to take into
consideration the current social distancing requirements and continued
pandemic risks, and therefore delay the scheduled conventions. More than
the required one-fourth (63.32%) of the Synod's member congregations
registered a vote, and the majority (90.67%) of votes cast favored adoption.
The stated extension of the 2019-2022 triennium by a year, allowing dis-
trict conventions to take place in either 2021 or 2022 and deferring the na-
tional Synod convention from 2022 to 2023, is therefore adopted.

The national Synod office is working urgently to make arrangements for the next regular convention of the Synod
to convene in the summer of 2023 and will keep the Synod apprised as plans are finalized, but to also watch for
communications from their districts regarding their plans to meet, either in 2021 or 2022, and to pay attention to
pre-convention schedules that may continue to be in flux.

Pastor Roser stated, "While we were a congregation who voted to "not" approve the resolution, there are certainly
no hard feelings on our end, and it will be our pleasure to join our sisters and brothers in Christ in moving forward
with a 2022 SWD Convention and a 2023 LCMS Convention. That's what it looks like to belong to a "synod" which
literally means "on the way together" or "walking together.""
