Carrie's Comments

As you all know by now, the Town of Rockford has received a \$1,200,000 state grant in the 2016 Capital Budget for our Wastewater Treatment project. This money is in addition to the \$1.8 million grant we received from the Dept. of Ecology for the same project. The council, staff and I are extremely excited and appreciative of this money! It's hard to even understand the positive impact this will have on our town.

Due to receiving these funds, there have been some questions about the \$40 loan fee that you see on your monthly utility bills. From the very beginning stages of this project, the council has been diligent to make sure the town can not only pay for the project, but can afford to maintain the new system. Maintenance and Operations money was built into the monthly fee, so there will be a reserve of M&O funds even as soon as the project was completed. Your elected officials are being very cautious and upfront about what this will cost and have discussed in council meetings how to proceed from here.

Your town council hasn't yet removed the fee because there is no way to know what the exact final cost of the project. We have requested (and received) funds based on engineer's estimates, but just like any project, there is always the risk of cost overruns or unforeseen issues that arise.

Once the last stage of work is complete, and all the costs are finalized, the council will decide how much of the \$40 to continue to apply to the reserve account, and how much to stop charging, lowering the monthly utility payment. I assure you that this council is committed to getting your bill lowered, while still maintaining the quality of this new facility.

The town is still under Stage 2 water shortage, but thanks to your efforts and all of us limiting our water usage, we have not needed to move into Stage 3. We will continue to monitor the wells, and are actively working to add well #4 back into production.

In the meantime, at town hall we using reclaimed water to benefit the few flowers we are growing. The drinking water has to be tested and logged every single day, and to do so the water must be continually run for several minutes. Now, we are capturing that water and using it. It's only a few gallons a week, but every bit helps. Hopefully you are aware of the water you are using in your home, and are making a conscious effort to reduce waste.
