PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES



Parent/Teacher Conferences will be scheduled in February and March. More details will be coming from your child's teacher and the office as we get closer to conference time. Guidelines:

Be on time or notify the office if you are running late for your conference. If you think you will need more than 15 minutes, please make special arrangements with your child's teacher in advance.
- For families with multiple children in the school we will work with you to schedule your conferences back to back whenever possible.
- Conferences are for adults only and baby-sitting arrangements should be made for your child and/or siblings.



WEATHER RELATED CLOSINGS AND DELAYED OPENINGS

BHPCNS follows Montgomery County Public Schools, MCPS, and emergency weather closings.

If MCPS schools are closed, BHPCNS will be closed.

If MCPS has a 2 hour delay, BHPCNS will begin the school day at 11:00 am, except Early Morning with Bradley Bear students who may arrive at 10:00 am.

Tuesday: Wigglin' Wizards

Chief Scientist Mrs. Myers Reports:

After a fantastic fall of hypotheses, experiments, conclusions, and "aha" moments of fun and discovery, the Bradley Bear scientists will be moving to a new unit on the five senses. We'll start with taste and learn how different spots on the tongue determine whether something is sweet, salty, sour or bitter. Later, we will focus on the sense of smell. We will blindfold the children and see if they can guess what's in the jar. The third week will be touch. They will use their hands to determine the shape of various objects in a bag. At the month's end, we will investigate the sense of hearing by playing a game where the children are once again blindfolded and have to point to the direction where the sound came from. We will also talk about how and why we rely on our senses; the roles each plays; their interdependence and what may happen when one sense is removed.

Mrs. Snyder Reports:

The Bradley Bears Dancers did a great job on their Nutcracker Performance. The children will begin expanding their movement vocabulary and moves. They will be moving from skipping to proper posse' marches, from balancing on one foot to arabesque. The concepts of plie', releve', and turn-out, will be reinforced this semester as they work toward acquiring the dance phrases needed for the Spring Show on May 23rd at 1:45. Artic Explorer Senarathne Reports: We will board a "plane" for our next adventure: the vast frozen continent, Antarctica. We will stay on this virtually uninhabited continent for the next three weeks. Did you know that not only does Antarctica have the highest elevation of all the continents but it is considered a desert with annual precipitation of only 8 inches along the coast and far less inland? We will learn about all of the animals that inhabit this vast area and do an experiment that will teach us how their blubber allows them to survive. We'll find out about its location, its climate, its animals and plants, and how it was discovered.

Yogi Leon Meditates: Every week, our yoga class focuses on a different theme. In January, we will use our yoga poses (asanas) and games to become Winter Olympians, Circus performers, and Superheroes. Finally, we will celebrate winter with our poses. We also continue to practice mindfulness by thinking about our breathing and eating mindfully. They will do the Beanie Bag Dance in order to demonstrate their ability to follow directions. Feliz Año Nuevo! (Happy New Year!) In January, we will wrap up our lesson on food where we learned how to say Yo quiero (I want) and Yo tengo (I have). We will also review numbers, colors, weather, food and family and then start our new topic on body parts. We will learn several new songs including Mi Cuerpo (My Body) and Cabeza, Hombros, Piernas, Pies (Tune of Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes).
