Andrew Mischung, 84 of Sebawaing, died Tuesday, Nov. 2, at Scheurer Hospital, Pigeon, following a long illness. He had been a patient in the Extended Care Unit for 10 years.

He was born in Chicago on Feb. 4, 1909, the son of the late Jacob and Katherine (Wingert) Mischung. The father, Jacob, was a longtime tailor in Sebawaing. Mr. Mischung was married to Mary Meisner on May 9, 1931, in Sebawaing.
