Many thanks to Fred Firkus for two great clinics at our October meeting. Fred showed some great examples of weathering using oil paints and I picked up some


techniques I want to try myself. And Fred had a HUGE display of kitbashed MOW vehicles. He is like a Dr. Frankenstein, taking stock vehicles apart and using the



pieces to make unique vehicles for his and others' railroads. Ever hear of liquid chrome? Fred introduced us to a paint pen that turns those unrealistic looking bumpers and grills on our vehicles into beautiful, gleaming chrome. Check out your favorite craft store for that one—I will.

Next month we welcome the return of Peter Schierloh, who did our clinic on the Railroad Reality Week at the Nevada Norther Railway last year. Pete Schierloh (known as "the Bridge Guy" by some) will present "Spanning the Soo" on the railroad bridges of the Soo Line. Over the years Mr. Schierloh has worked on many former Soo Line railroad bridges and he will be sharing some of his experiences with structures built by the Soo. Pete will speak about battling monumental floods across North Dakota, working on the massive Arcola High Bridge, pushing the limits to keep the Soo's beleaguered bridge over the Red River of the North in service, and more. I'm sure there will be many of the finer points of bridge construction that will help us make our model bridges look more realistic and structurally sound.

We will also welcome Keith Kohlmann via Zoom. Keith is the author of the new Kalmbach book Model Realistic Freight Car Loads and first presented this great clinic at the Indy Junction convention. Keith will give us prototype examples of freight car loads from common to unique,



small to large. He will show how to properly model the loads, secure the loads, and operate them on your railroad.

So come along while we load up on information on bridging the gap between our models and the real thing.

By now you should of received your email regarding the updated Electronic Red Book. Hopefully you didn't have any problems opening, downloading or saving it to your computer.



A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with **3 introductory puzzles** to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.



Motion by Preston, second by Down, to approve the minutes of the August 8, 2022, meeting. Motion carried.

Paymaster Report

Bob McGeever presented highlights of the 2022 - 2023 budget and the August paymaster report.

Rail School - January 8th, 2023 - Dr. Clancy listed the items that he will be needing for the Rail School: transport the youth layout from and back to the storage facility 2 switching layouts are needed - 1 layout needs some maintenance, looking for another switching layout Blue Box Kits are already on hand projector and screen for model railroad videos to be provided by Bob McGeever T-Track modules and the tables to set up the T-Track layout assistance with setup and take down **Rail Show - February 19th and 20th, 2023 -** Bob McGeever will be meeting with the Rail Show Committee to formalize the new ticketing process that will meet the Madison Fire Department requirements. Bob is also working on sending out the invitations to the vendors, exhibitors, and organizations that have layouts to display.

Website - www.nmra-scwd.org - The National Model Railroad Association is looking at hosting Division websites and electronic mail services. The Constant Contact system may be replaced with the system provided by the NMRA. There may also be a system that will replace our ZOOM system.

The www.nmra.org website is UNDERUSED by its members. There is a direct link from our SCWD website to the National Model Railroad Association website. You will need to register your NMRA membership to view the "members only" information on the different pages of the NMRA website.

Old Business:

Youth Group - Steve Preston and Phil Hottmann toured the **Noble Knights** facility in Fitchburg. More investigation is needed for use of their Community Room and dates needed. Also discussed was additional storage space needed for the Youth Group equipment. The equipment is currently stored in the SCWD storage facility, but due to space constraints, it is difficult to get at. It needs better accessibility for transport to the Youth Group meetings. Steve will be getting a contact list of youth group participants from Steve Brist. Hopefully, the T-Track modules will be available for the January Rail School.

By-Law Update - Bill Mitchell has the *Microsoft Publisher* to *Microsoft Word* By-Laws document that was extracted by Bob McGeever. John Kosobucki and Bill Mitchell will attempt to standardize the format of the By-Laws document. The newly formatted document will include the **Don Herling "Madison Mac" Award** by-law amendment that was adopted at the August 8 SCWD Board of Directors Meeting.

New Business:

General Membership Meeting Issues

There were some issues with the presentation of video files at the September membership meeting. The issues should be resolved with an up -to-date computer system with a current operating system. A motion was made by McGeever, second by Dr. Clancy, to spend up to \$600.00 for the purchase of a new laptop computer system. The motion was carried. John Kosobucki will investigate and confer with Bob McGeever to make the purchase of a laptop computer system. The old laptop computer will still be used.

There was also a Verona Senior Center Training Room door lock issue so the microphone volume control was not accessible. The facility is undergoing the switch from keys to an electronic access system. The change-over should be completed by October.

POD Cast like "The Crossing" - A member suggested the creation of a POD Cast for the SCWD organization. This idea will be put on "HOLD" until the NMRA rolls out the new website services to the Regions and Divisions.

Noble Knights - The dimensions of the floor space needed to store the Youth Group layout and equipment need to be given to the Noble Knights facilities managers so that the managers can determine if the equipment can be stored at their facility. An idea was also discussed about having someone from Noble Knights present a clinic on the scenery, paint, and other modeling tools and materials that are used by other modelers outside of the model railroad hobby.

Life Membership List - Phil Hottmann and Tom Morrison will be working on updating the list of Life Members of the SCWD that were supplied by the Region. There are about 7 to 10 members that still need to have their membership contact information verified.

Awards Judging Sub-Committee - A discussion with Ken Hojnacki is still needed to have him form an Awards Judging Sub-Committee of SCWD members with some awards experience.

Adjournment:

A motion was made by McGeever, second by Dingman, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:31 pm.





If you get an e-mail that you don't want, just hit the delete key. Furthermore, if you use the update link, your change may not be timely posted to the NMRA membership database.

If you need to change your email address with the NMRA please follow these directions:

The direct way is to log on to the "Members" page of the NMRA website, choose the "View your NMRA membership" box on the right side of the screen, scroll down to the bottom of the page and select "Update". Enter the new email address in the appropriate box and click "Submit".
