We will give thanks for all the projects we have completed on our building especially the new ceiling in the parish hall! Great food, music, and fellowship! More details will follow soon!

PARISH HALL

Due to your generous financial support, we were able to complete improvements to our parish hall ceiling. New lighting and an acoustic ceiling should make for delightful fellowship. We completed improvements UNDER BUDGET and on schedule. To ensure we respect our financial investment, while leaving it in great condition for our next generation of parishioners, we are asking you to follow the following guidelines.

1) NEVER attach any material to the acoustic ceiling tiles (tape, pins, paper clips, etc.). Acoustic ceiling tiles are fragile, are easily damaged and cost \$8/tile.

2) When there are events requiring special celebration (ribbons, balloons, etc.), material must be attached to either the oak wooden shadow boxes or drywall using blue painters tape. NEVER secure material to the ceiling tile!

The lighting panel is located between the double doors on the south wall. Instructions for turning lights on and off are above the touch screen pad. We can not thank you enough for making this capital improvement possible. If you would like to make a financial commitment to cover remaining \$20,000 in expenses, please complete a financial commitment card found on the communication wall in the Narthex. It is time to enjoy our newly renovated parish hall.
