Frequently Asked Questions About Denton African American Scholarship Fund

Find the answers to your general questions below:

- 1. How much are DAASF awards? **DAASF scholarship awards vary year to year based on the Foundation's ability to raise funds in support of students.**
- 2. What may the scholarship funds be used for? Funds are paid to the student's college/university to go toward the recipient's costs (tuition/fees/room/board)
- 3. Where can I obtain an application for a DAAFS scholarship? The Foundation/Committee work with counselors at each of Denton ISD's high schools. The counselors disseminate the application to interested students.
- 4. What is the deadline for submitting my application for a DAASF scholarship? Once the application is provided for the high school counselors, students have 10 days to complete and return the application to the counselor.
- 5. When are the scholarships awarded? Scholarships are presented to the recipients in April
- 6. How will I be notified if I am awarded a scholarship? Parents of the applicants as well as their school counselor are informed of their applicant's award in late March or early April
- 7. When are the scholarship funds available to me for use at my institution? The foundation makes funds available to each student's college/university beginning September 1 upon receipt from the student of proof of enrollment and other pieces of information. Scholarship recipients receive a letter from the Foundation identifying all required information needed in order for the funds to be provided to the college/university.

- 8. Where does funding for the DAASF scholarships come from? **DAASF** funding comes from individuals, community organizations and businesses but primarily from individual donations.
- 9. Does DAASF offer scholarships for K-12? **No, only for graduating high** school seniors
- 10. Does DAASF provide scholarships for summer school? No
- 11. Does DAASF offer any internship opportunities? No
- 12. Does DAASF provide scholarships for study abroad? If the student is enrolled in an approved college/university
