Pepsi & Pete Comic Strip Update - by Phil Dillman

Pepsi and Pete, the Pepsi-Cola Cops, were featured in the Sunday comic strips in a number of newspapers across North America from 1939 to 1950. In our quest to locate every Pepsi & Pete strip, we have learned a number of facts.

The characters were created by the Newell-Emmett Advertising Agency for Pepsi-Cola.

The characters were drawn by a number of different artists, one of whom was the celebrated illustrator, Rube Goldstein.

The strips were occasionally featured in one market's paper one week with the same strip appearing in another part of the country the following week.

The strip, such as the one to the right, could also be found in comic books.

The strips in Canada were often shortened versions of the ones used in the United States, with the ones used in the Province of Quebec in French, such as the ones pictured below. These versions were in either color or black & white.

Originally, the large cop had the name of Pepsi and the small cop was Pete. Later strip artists switched the names around with one of the artists actually changing the name of the strip to "Pepsi," the Pepsi-Cola Cop.

We are currently aware of about 100 different strips from the U.S. and more than three dozen strips in French from Canada. Eventually, we hope to either post each strip on the website or save them in book form.

In addition to the 68 strips that I purchased this summer, Tom Gabriel and June Frost are helping immensely with this project. We will update you as we continue learning about these strips.

Memo from the Secretary - by Diane Gabriel

I have enjoyed getting to know some of you through my work as the Secretary of the Pepsi-Cola Collectors Club. I hope when you have called, sent an e-mail, or a note that you have been satisfied with my responses and service. As nearly 10 months have gone by since I began this role, I'd like to share with you information about our membership rolls, dues, and how things are processed.

The PCCC Board of Directors has established guidelines for renewals. Renewal notices are sent out the month before your renewal date (month) and you have until the end of the month of your renewal month to submit payment before being placed on the "Grace Period" list. Once on the Grace Period list you will have 90 days to pay your dues to maintain "Active" Member status, which will give you one more newsletter before being moved to the "Inactive" list. After the 90 days, if no payment has been received you will be placed on the Inactive List. Once on the Inactive List, you will no longer receive the PCCC newsletter, you will be blocked from the PCCC Members Area of the website, and you will not receive any other club related

correspondence or benefits. However, all is not lost, all you need to do to restore your active membership status is to pay your dues and all rights and access will be restored. We have established these guidelines to be good stewards of the club's resources.

As of this printing we currently have 615 Primary Members, 191 Associate Members, 2 Junior Member and have enrolled 54 new members in 2011. The PCCC has a rolling enrollment which means your dues are due on the anniversary date (month) of when you joined, as opposed to an annual date for everyone. I have been issuing renewals based on the information I received when I became Secretary of the PCCC. I appreciate all of you who have made timely payments as this helps the Club Treasury maintain a comfortable balance to cover PCCC related expenses. I do realize that some of you have gotten into the habit of paying your dues, no matter when they are due, when you register for Pepsi Fest, but paying your dues when your renewal arrives helps us keep our records and funds up to date, and will prevent you from being placed in the Grace Period or in the Inactive Rolls. It would be greatly appreciated if in the coming year that you submit your dues when your renewal is sent and received.

In an effort to maintain accurate Membership records the PCCC Board purchased a Membership computer program. The one feature of this program was that it required an ID number for each member. So I developed and assigned an ID number to all members. You will see your seven digit number in the upper right hand corner of your address label on this newsletter. Take the time to note this ID number for in the future it will be used for various club promotions and is a quick reference for our records.






Something Old, Something New at Pepsi Fest



The Southern California Chapter will be meeting April 14 at the home of David Gerger in Corona, CA, and will have their picnic on June 9.







In 2011 we welcomed 57 new members. To date in 2012 we have 27 new members, 5 of whom joined at Pepsi Fest.

We had 235 adults and 10 children in attendance at Pepsi Fest, of that number 30 people registered at the door, and we mailed 11 purchased packets.



We must meet at least 85% of that guarantee or the Club is responsible to pay for the unused room nights, even if the hotel fills them with other guests.

At that rate we DO NOT get charged for using the Harrison Room, Liberty Hall or Veterans Hall. Following is what those rooms would cost if we had to pay to use them. Liberty Hall is \$5,750.00 per day – we use it for 3 days which would be a total cost of \$17,250.00. Veterans Hall is \$1,200.00 per section per day and we use 3 sections for 1 day (for the Silent Auction) for a total of \$3,600.00. And the Harrison Room (registration) is \$150.00 per day and we use it for 5 days for a total of \$750.00. So the total charge to rent those spaces is \$21,600.00.

The total charge for 311 rooms nights is \$31,411.00 and if you subtract the meeting space charges that leaves a balance of \$9,811.00 divided by 311 nights that makes the actual room charge per night **only \$31.55**. We feel that's a great price for the service and amenities that we receive at the Marriott. The reason that we are sharing this information is that it's important for those attending Pepsi Fest to seriously consider booking their room at the Marriott if at all possible. We understand that funds are tight for everyone, and neighboring hotels offer lower rates, but if the Club doesn't meet its guaranteed room nights the Club would owe the **\$21,600.00 for the meeting spaces PLUS** all the unused room nights which means the Club could owe the hotel anywhere from \$25,000 to \$40,000 in room charges. We have been able to meet our contract guarantee to date, but we wanted the membership to know the facts about our contract with Marriott and to use this information when you make your plans and book your room for Pepsi Fest 2013 which is March 14-16, 2013.


