Pastor Sands Writes . . .

The Sunday School year has ended, and as many of you know, we celebrated Confirmation Day last Sunday, May 18th. Jackson McGee, with the affirmation of his Baptism and accepting personal responsibility of the promises by his parents and sponsors, became the newest adult member of Chimney Rock Lutheran Church. What many of you do not know is that in preparation to be confirmed, I ask the students to write a Personal Faith Statement. Usually, when I give this assignment in the fall, and get that wide-eyed look of bewilderment, I suggest the students use the Apostles Creed as a model and write about their faith in terms of their understanding of, and feelings toward God as three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This year however, Jackson wrote about his faith with a more comprehensive view, including his thoughts on community and the environment. I think that you will find his thoughts to be interesting as well as thought provoking. Maybe his statement will cause you to think about your own faith as well.

Jackson McGee's Faith Statement

My faith is a love and compassion, also trust. I believe that these values are essential for building a better belief. I will strive to embody these values in my daily life, through acts of service, kindness, and generosity.

My faith is also rooted in the concept of my community. I believe that faith is not a solo journey, but rather a shared experience. Chimney Rock, in particular, has played a significant role in my faith development, providing a sense of belonging, support, and accountability. Through my involvement in church activities, I have formed meaningful relationships with others who share my values and passions.

Through my encounters with nature, I have come to appreciate the connections with people, and the importance of living in peace with the earth.

This is my personal narrative that is shaped by my relationships, encounters, and reflections, and it continues to improve as I journey through life.

Chimney Rock Congregational Council Minutes - May 12, 2025

Call to Order—Trustee Don Solfest called the May 12, 2025, meeting to order at 6:41pm. Members present: Monica Dejno, Jerry Erickson, Barb McGee, Forrest Nutter, Mary Olson, Pastor David Sands, Dan Solfest, and Barb Sylla. Richard Gunderson was absent.

Devotions—Pastor Sands read John 13:31-35 and led in discussion. Monica shared an opening prayer.

Secretary's Report was read by Barb. Mary and Jerry motioned to accept, and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report—Dan distributed the report ending April 30, 2025. Barb M. made a motion to accept, Barb S. seconded, and motion carried. Dan distributed the report for the Spring Chicken Dinner Fundraiser. Forrest made a motion to accept, Mary seconded, and motion carried.

Old Business:

- 1) No bid yet from Jurowski Construction for repairing/painting small bell tower windows. Storm windows need painting, and we'll seek bids for that also.
- 2) The Certificate of Deposit held in First National Bank was reinvested into a CD at Independence State Bank in April when it reached maturity.
- 3) The chicken dinner on April 27th went very smoothly, with net proceeds of \$5,465, due to more donations and fewer expenses.
- 4) Member updates were given on Kim Jacobson and Mavis Erickson.
- 5) Forrest will swap keys with Monica, so she will have a front-door key.
- 6) Soren Hovey will attend Luther Park Bible Camp from July 6-11, 2025.

 Dan has reimbursed the Hoveys the \$100 that the church donates, as well as an anonymous \$100 donation from a parishioner.
- 7) There was more discussion about incentives for youth who attend summer worship and recording of that attendance.
- 8) High school graduates, Carson and Broc Coburn, were recognized on May 4. Thank you to Barb McGee for furnishing ice cream and to Forrest and Jeanne Nutter who donated a decorated cake to honor both graduates, as well as Jackson McGee who will be confirmed this month.

New Business:

- 1) Jackson McGee will be affirming his baptism on May 18.
- 2) No service at Chimney Rock on July 6, 2025, as we will attend the July 4th Ecumenical Worship at the Pleasantville Ballpark.
- 3) 155th Anniversary—Two possible dates are September 28 or October 19, depending on when the Lorn & Royce Band is available.
- 4) Monica reported there are now 35 SAMS in the Northwest Synod, and the number is growing.
- 5) Pastor Sands attended the Synod Assembly on April 26 and will give a brief report at our June council meeting.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Monday, June 9, at 6:30pm.

Adjournment—Mary and Barb M. motioned to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:51pm.
