Roser Reflection . . .

Dear Friends,

Thanks to everyone's generosity, our congregation was able to provide \$140.00 to the school in order to help fund uniforms for those families who may have difficulty affording them, as well as a back-up supply in the school office for when a student needs to borrow a uniform piece (we never underestimate the soil and tear threats of the playground). I also want to share with you the text of a letter that I sent home to all families this week.

Welcome to St. John's! It is a delight to work with your children. They are kind and polite, and a real joy to know. I enjoy interacting with them during their lunch periods.

I want to give you a short summary of who I am. I am originally from the Pittsburgh area. My wife, Dawn, and I have three daughters ages 22, 17, and 14. My passions outside of Gospel-centered neighborhood ministry are dogs, baseball, and cycling. I have been a pastor for 17 years and I am now in my fifth year here at St. John's. For a brief time between college and seminary, I taught Jr/Sr High School in the Woodland Hills School District in Pittsburgh.

I have the privilege of leading worship for our children each Thursday morning. Mr. King has graciously allowed me to offer two chapels (one for scholars in the K4/K5 class and one for the scholars in the upper grades). Our Thursday morning chapels will be held at 8:15 for the K4/K5 class and 9:00 for the upper grades. If you would like to attend a chapel, please come to the church door at the top of the ramp on the Bluff Street side of the church prior to chapel and I will let you in. We keep the church doors locked at all times on weekdays in order to ensure the safety of our school.

Our congregation and I want very much to serve you and your children. If there are ways in which we may be of service to you, please let me know.
