

# Retired Elkton Pastor Dies; Rev. Louis E. Burges, 67

ELKTON — The Rev. Louis E. Burgess, 67, who retired two weeks ago as pastor of St. Paul Evangelical United Brethren church here, died Saturday night in Hubbard Memorial hospital, Bad Axe.

He had been a patient in the hospital eight days since suffering a heart attack.

Born July 4, 1888, in Munith, Mich., he had been a minister for 36 years, 13 of them in Elkton.

He had planned to live in Elkton and be available as a guest preacher.

His wife, Irene, died Feb. 15, 1955.

Surviving are: two daughters, Mrs. Maxine Walker, Bluffton, O., and Mrs. Marlene Herford, Elkton; a son, Russell Burgess, Elkton; five grandchildren; two brothers and two sisters.

Colgan funeral chapel. Funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at St. Paul church. The Rev. Morris Bauman, the new pastor, will officiate.

The body will be taken to Jackson for funeral services at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon in Greenwood Park Evangelical United Brethren church, where Mr. Burgess had been a former pastor. The Rev. Norman Klump will officiate. Burial will be in Woodland cemetery.
