

2020 CSBA All Canada Online Purebred Sheep Sale

Rules and Terms & Conditions

1. Consignors must be current (2020) members of the Canadian Sheep Breeders Association.
2. All animals must be born the property of the consignor and be purebreds registered with the CSBA/CLRC.
3. Breeders may enter as many ewes as they wish. There is a limit of 4 rams /breed.
4. There is a \$20 nonrefundable entry fee for each animal entered. Payment needs to be received by closing date June 10, 2020. Payment can be made by cheque or e-transfer (office@sheepbreeders.ca) VISA or MC.
5. Closing date for entry photos/ media to the sale is June 10, 2020.
6. All photos of animals will be subject to a check by a culling committee; their decision is final.
7. Please submit information of the animal along with pictures/videos to office@sheepbreeders.ca. The sellers are responsible for the accuracy of the information provided. Please use the Consignment Form provided or the online Form at www.sheepbreeders.ca
8. All signed registration papers **MUST be received by the CSBA office by June 30, 2020** to participate in the sale. Don't delay in sending the paperwork in as there will be no exceptions to this! Should the animals not sell, the registration paperwork will be returned to the owner. If any GenOvis information has been provided for the catalogue, please include a copy for verification as well.

PHOTOS AND VIDEO LINKS:

- All photos will need to be received by the CSBA office by Wednesday June 10, 2020. You can provide a link to your own videos as well and all media is to be submitted electronically to office@sheepbreeders.ca
- The seller is responsible for providing current and unaltered photos of the animals. All photos should be on solid ground and show all sides of the animal (front, back and both sides) as well as CSIP tag number or tattoo matching their registration papers.
- Animals must be completely slick sheared with head and leg details up to owner's discretion
- Wool breeds must supply photo of parted fleece

This sale is intended for the improvement of the purebred industry and ultimately the best animals are expected to be provided to maintain the integrity of your production. If photos have not been received and approved by the Sale Committee, they are unable to participate in the sale.

The online catalogue will be available on the DMSL website commencing June 20, 2020.

ORDER OF SALE – TIMED AUCTION EVENT:

1) This is a timed auction event, bidding will commence for all animals on July 10th at 9:00 am MST and end at 6 pm on Saturday July 11, 2020 MST. This is a “racehorse style” finish where any bidding within the last 5 minutes will extend the time clock another 5 minutes. When there are no bids for 5 minutes, the computer will deem the sale over. Animals will be categorized by breed on the online catalogue. There will be additional information for buyers regarding proxy bidding or phone bidding provided on the website.

2) Within each breed, they will be: yearling ewes, senior ewe lambs, junior ewe lambs, yearling rams, senior ram lambs, junior ram lambs.

Yearling Ewe – born September 1, 2018 to August 31, 2019

Senior Ewe Lamb – born September 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019

Junior Ewe Lamb – born January 1, 2020 to March 1, 2020

Yearling Ram – born September 1, 2018 to August 31, 2019

Senior Ram Lamb – born September 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019

Junior Ram Lamb – born January 1, 2020 to March 1, 2020

HEALTH and SOUNDNESS:

All animals will be rigidly culled by the CSBA culling committee based on the photos and videos submitted prior to the sale. Please inspect your animals carefully. The following list outlines some of the undesirable physical traits that will serve as cause for an animal to be culled but does not exclude other reasons that an animal may be culled.

1. Malocclusion / Dental Alignment
2. Lameness
3. Presence of external parasites
4. Orf lesions
5. Abscess
6. Entropion
7. Genital malformation
8. Body condition score less than 2
9. Tail length
10. Any other condition that concerns the committee

The committee is authorized to settle all disputes regarding culling and to interpret the rules. The committee culls based on health and sale standards, not breed standards. Their decision will be final.

All animals that have been culled are not permitted to participate in the sale.

REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES:

- Original registration certificates must be signed on the back for transfer and submitted to the CSBA office by no later than Tuesday June 30, 2020. Any papers received after this date will be unable to participate in the sale. There will be NO EXEPTIONS. It will be the responsibility of the seller to ensure the papers are submitted on time. Failure to supply the registration certificates will cause the animal to be excused from the sale. Following the sale and financial settlement, the CSBA office will process transfers and the cost will be deducted from the consignor's sale proceeds along with the 7% commission fee. The transferred registration paper will be sent directly to the buyer from the CLRC.

IDENTIFICATION: All consigned animals must either bear legible tattoos or paired CSIP tags. Confirmation that the identification stated on the registration paper is borne by the consigned animal is the responsibility of the seller. All consigned animals must bear a CSIP tag according to CFIA regulations. Animals failing to meet the identification standards will not be permitted to participate in the sale.

Any animals stating genotype results in their description, must be from the animal in the sale, and will require proof with their registration papers.

COMMISSION: Sale commission is 7%. Sale commission will be deducted from the consignor's proceeds, along with any applicable transfer fees. If a reserve bid is provided and the animal does not sell, the consignor is still responsible for the commission based on the reserve bid. All animals in the sale will have a minimum \$250 bid price.

BUYERS: Buyers must be registered with the auction company and must provide their full name, address, telephone number and email address as this will indicate exactly how each animal is to be transferred.

TERMS: Payment is preferred by e-transfer (office@sheepbreeders.ca), Visa or MasterCard but bank drafts and personal cheques will also be accepted. Any animals purchased by credit card (VISA/MC) will be subject to an additional 3% fee. All cheques should be made out to CSBA. Registration papers will not be submitted to CLRC until payments have cleared the bank.

GUARANTEE: Each consignor guarantees clear right and title to all animals that present for sale.

All males are guaranteed breeders. Should any ram fail to prove to be a breeder, any claim for adjustment must be made within 12 months of the date of sale. A satisfactory settlement shall

be deemed to be replacement with another ram of equal value and health status or refund of purchase price.

The seller shall have the right, if so desired, to try a ram for as much as 75 days to determine whether he is a satisfactory breeder, before making final adjustment.

All females are guaranteed breeders. Should any female 12 months of age or older, not pregnant at the time of sale, fail to become pregnant during the current breeding season, the purchaser has the right to claim adjustment in writing to the seller within 12 months of the sale. Should any female younger than 12 months of age and not pregnant at the time of sale, fail to become pregnant during the current breeding season, the purchaser should notify the seller within 12 months from the date of sale, but wait to see if the ewe again fails to become pregnant by 24 months of age, before claiming adjustment in writing to the seller. Satisfactory settlement shall be deemed to be replacement with another ewe of equal value and health status or refund of purchase price.

The purchaser shall notify the seller as soon as any concern with an animal arises.

Exposed ewes of any age, even if marked prior to sale, are not guaranteed to be pregnant or produce living lambs.

Under no conditions will the seller be liable for more than the original purchase price of the animal.

The seller may direct the marketing of the animal and refund the difference between the purchase price and the market value as shown on the sales receipt.

All transportation charges are the responsibility of the buyer.

Any settlement of such guarantee is between the seller and buyer and is subject to the restrictions set out above.

The Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association assume no responsibility, expressed or implied, with respect to this guarantee or the restrictions set out above.

RISK/REMOVAL: All animals are at purchaser's risk as soon as sold. Arrangements should be made within 7 days between seller and buyer or unless other terms are agreed upon.

LIABILITY: The Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association, and their directors, and employees accept no liability that may occur.
