



Note for Parishioners on Schismatic Latin Mass Group

Recently, a group has been gathering at a Harrisburg area hotel on Sunday for a Latin Mass. The person presenting himself as a priest is a member of the Roman Catholic Institute, a schismatic group that rejects the authority of the Holy Father, the local Bishop and the validity of the Second Vatican Council.

This group is not in communion with the Roman Catholic Church, and Catholics should not participate in these services.

In the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg, there are three churches where the Mass is legitimately celebrated in Latin according to the Roman Missal of 1962. They are:

St. Lawrence of Rome Church, Harrisburg

St. Joseph Church, Lancaster

St. Elijah the Prophet Oratory, Mt. Carmel




The Parish Council of Our Lady of the Visitation parish is needing 3 more new members to fill vacant seats. The va-



"Finally, before we left Monsignor King told all of us to reflect on one final thing. 'If Christianity were a crime, would you be guilty?'"

This is the last line of a series of comments from one of your contemporaries about the 45th Men's Retreat. This young man attended last year's retreat for the third year in a row with his father and grandfather. They have already registered for this year's retreat. He has also reached out to some of his peers to attend this year. Consider these words along with the theme from this year's retreat "The Urgency and Drama of Our Lives" How could time with Jesus help you deal with what you see and hear in the news on a daily basis. News that is filled with war, suffering, and a lack of compassion and LOVE for our fellow individuals. Faith is tested and grows during these adolescent years? Psalm 95 states "Oh, that today you would hear His voice, do not harden your hearts". "If you don't know the bad news, the good news is no news" is the subtopic of this retreat which really talks to us about that "news" mentioned above.

Discussing the Readings with your children

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost and the end of the Easter Season. This is the special day that Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit to guide the apostles and us. It is the birthday of the Church.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Blessed Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We pray to the Holy Spirit when we pray the Sign of the Cross. We receive the Holy Spirit when we are baptized . The Holy Spriit is our guide, our teacher and our helper.

What are some ways that the Holy Spirit teaches us, helps us and guides us?

The Holy Spirit helps us follow the teachings of Jesus. The Holy Spirit invites us to grow closer to God. The Holy Spirit guides us towards goodness and holiness. The Holy Spirit encourages us to share the love of Christ with all people.

The gift of the Holy Spirit is strengthened at Confirmation. We are strengthened to carry on the work of Christ in the world. We might not all be call to great things, be we are all called to do everything with the love of Christ.

In the first reading, the Holy Spirit is described as a noisy wind and tongues of fire. In the Gospel, Jesus calls the Holy Spirit the Advocate who teaches.

Even though the apostles were afraid and did not know what to do, the Holy Spirit gave them the power to continue Jesus' mission. If we accept the Holy spirit's help and guidance, we too will be given the courage to do and say the right thing.
