VA Accountability, Whistleblower Protection Act Becomes Law:

The VFW is saluting President Trump for signing into law today the VFWchampioned *Department of Veterans Affairs Accountability and Whistleblower Protection Act of 2017.*

"Accountability must be a two-way street, and today's signing now provides VA Secretary Dr. David Shulkin the authority to manage his people in a manner expected of all senior executives, public or private," said VFW National Commander Brian Duffy, who attended the White House signing ceremony along with VFW Adjutant General Bob Wallace and others. "Three years ago, a nationwide crisis in access to care and confidence engulfed the entire VA," said Duffy. "Weeding out the nonperformers and those whose personal conduct brings doubt and dishonor upon thousands of dedicated employees is essential to restoring the full faith of veterans in their VA," he said. "Today's signing will not instantly fix an employee culture of indifference to appointed leadership that took years - if not decades — to fester, but it does send a very loud and unmistakable signal to all employees that maintaining the status guo no longer works for those who have borne the battle," he said. "Let the healing begin."

VA Women's Summit - Registration:

The Department of Veterans Affairs Center for Women Veterans is hosting a Women Veterans Summit in Houston, August 25-26. Information on health care and benefits will be widely discussed. Topics such as culture change and gender- specific care will be hosted on panels and many partnering organizations will host exhibits. VFW staff will participate in panel discussions on women veterans, as well as at an exhibit.

PTSD In June the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) launched a new online tool that will help Veterans compare various treatment options for post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The PTSD Treatment Decision Aid is a free, interactive online tool that helps educate patients about effective treatment options for PTSD and encourages them to participate actively in decisions about their care.

The tool includes information about evidence-based PTSD treatments, such as talk therapy and prescription medication options. It also includes useful information designed for people who have served in the military. Users can watch videos of providers explaining different treatment options and what to expect with those treatments, and hear from Veterans who have benefited from them.

Have you ever wondered if anyone in Europe remembers America 's sacrifice in World War II? There is an answer in a small town in the Czech Republic . The town is Pilsen (Plzen).



Every 5 years, Pilsen conducts the Liberation Celebration of the City of Pilsen in the Czech Republic . May 6th, 2010, marked the 65th anniversary of the liberation of Pilsen by General George Patton's 3rd Army. Pilsen is the town that every American should visit. Because they love America and the American Soldier.



Even 65 years later... by the thousands, the citizens of Pilsen came to say thank you.

Another chapter in this important story... the Czech people are teaching their children about America's sacrifice for their freedom.

In the Czech Republic , the school children of the equivalent of fifth grade are each assigned one of the American and Canadian liberators buried there.

The Soldier's grave is the student's responsibility for the year and they learn all there is to know of their own hero. Their surviving family is sent letters and they respond to the annual child who tends their loved one's grave.



This is the crash site of Lt. Virgil P. Kirkham, the last recorded American USAAF pilot killed in Europe during WWII. It was Lt. Kirkham's 82nd mission and one that he volunteered to go on.

At the time this 20-year-old pilot's P-47 Thunderbolt plane was shot down, a young 14-year-old Czech girl, Zdenka Sladkova, was so moved by his sacrifice she made a vow to care for him and his memory. For <u>65 straight years</u>, Zdenka, now 79-years-old, took on the responsibility to care for Virgil's crash site and memorial near her home.

On May 4th, she was recognized by the Mayor of Zdenka's home town of Trhanova, Czech Republic , for her sacrifice and extraordinary effort to honor this American hero.

COMMENT:

This is a wonderful "commitment to honor" the people of Pilsen have shown.

It is sad to know that some in our own Country are so callous and disrespectful of the sacrifices our Veterans have made.

I am thankful that our VFW and Auxiliary members across the Country have accepted the privilege of serving our Veterans.
