With 34 of our 86 Arizona Units reporting—<u>just</u> the 2023-2024 "Veteran and Military impact":

- Over 220,000 volunteer hours. Using the National "VA value rate" of \$31.80, this represents over:
 - \$7 million dollars in volunteer value!
- Nearly \$400,000 in monetary donations+ \$70,000 "in-kind" donations (value of items donated)
- Over 32,000 Veterans/Military assisted





Winnie and her husband, Bob, work together to meet the needs of veterans through any organization that will help them! Their current project is raising funds for a Purple Heart Wall at the State home.






