On behalf of the BHPCNS Board, we want to thank everyone for your support of BHPCNS's recent Enchanted Forest Prom and family Pajama Breakfast fundraisers. These fun community builders raised just over \$10,000 to partially replenish the school's Alla Johnson Memorial Scholarship Fund. In recent years, the Alla Johnson fund has provided \$20,000-\$25,000 per year in need-based tuition assistance, allowing between 6 and 8 children and their families the opportunity to be part of our special school community.

CDC RECOMMENDED MILESTONES FOR CHILDREN

SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

2 YEARS-OLD

- Notices when others are hurt or upset, like pausing or looking sad when someone is crying
- Looks at your face to see how to react in a new situation

3 YEARS-OLD

- Calms down within 10 minutes after you leave her, like at a childcare drop off
- lacksquare Notices other children and joins them to play

4 YEARS-OLD

- Pretends to be something else during play (teacher, superhero, dog)
- Asks to go play with children if none are around
- Comforts others who are hurt or sad, like hugging a crying friend
- Avoids danger, like not jumping from tall heights at the playground
- Likes to be a "helper"
- Changes behavior based on where she is (place of worship, library, playground

MOVEMENT/PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

2 YEARS-OLD

- Kicks a ball
- **Runs**
- Walks (not climbs) up a few stairs with or without help
- Eats with a spoon

3 YEARS-OLD

- Strings items together, like large beads or macaroni
- Puts on some clothes by himself, like loose pants or a jacket
- ✓ Uses a fork

4 YEARS-OLD

- Catches a large ball most of the time
- Serves herself food or pours water, with adult supervision
- Unbuttons some buttons
- Holds crayon or pencil between fingers and thumb (not a fist)

LANGUAGE/COMMUNICATION

2 YEARS-OLD

- Points to things in a book when you ask, like "Where is the bear?"
- Says at least two words together, like "More milk."
- Points to at least two body parts when you ask him to show you
- Uses more gestures than just waving and pointing, like blowing a kiss or nodding yes

3 YEARS-OLD

- Talks with you in conversation using at least two back-and-forth exchanges
- Asks "who," "what," "where," or "why" questions, like "Where is mommy/daddy?"
- Says what action is happening in a picture or book when asked, like "running," "eating," or "playing"
- Says first name, when asked
- Talks well enough for others to understand, most of the time

4 YEARS-OLD

- Says sentences with four or more words
- Says some words from a song, story, or nursery rhyme"
- Talks about at least one thing that happened during his day, like "I played soccer."
- Answers simple questions like "What is a coat for?" or "What is a crayon for?"

COGNITIVE

2 YEARS-OLD

- Holds something in one hand while using the other hand; for example, holding a container and taking the lid off
- Tries to use switches, knobs, or buttons on a toy
- Plays with more than one toy at the same time, like putting toy food on a toy plate

3 YEARS-OLD

- Draws a circle, when you show him how
- Avoids touching hot objects, like a stove, when you warn her

4 YEARS-OLD

- Names a few colors of items
- Tells what comes next in a well-known story
- Draws a person with three or more body parts



SPEECH & OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCREENINGS



Developmental milestones are things most children (75% or more) can do by a specified age. Now is a great time to revisit your child's progress over the course of this school year. After reviewing the checklist from the CDC, please consult with your child's teacher on areas in which your son/daughter excels and areas he/she may need additional support. We have scheduled FREE speech and occupational therapy screenings for mid April. Should you wish to recommend your child for a screening, just let your teacher or Liz know. Parents will receive a letter in advance of the screening with additional details and a permission slip. We need the permission slip to be signed and returned in advance of the screenings.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

MCPS Kindergarten Registration began March 18th

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.




Rita and Ralph's Rotten Day by Carmen Agra Deedy – Two best friends meet to play each day until one makes the other angry.



AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Goodstein

Mrs. Goodstein reports:

We have been to the farm and now we are headed to the zoo. Animal signs always illustrate a unique feature of an animal. Ask your child if they remember the sign for sheep. And get excited to learn the sign for rhinoceros!

In our second class, we will learn the signs for opposites. It is fun to see all the opposites the kids can think of on their own.



ART (all ages) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese



In Art, we will concentrate on the basics. Our 2 year-olds will practice holding a pencil/crayon correctly and draw lines and circles. Our 3 year-olds will follow instructions and draw a face. Our 4 year-olds will follow instructions and draw a cat/dog.













MUSIC (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Little Hands



Happy Spring from Little Hands! In April, music classes will follow the theme of "Bugs, Bees, and Butterflies!"

Bugs who creep down low, and others that fly up high - we'll be exploring those physical and musical opposites this month! In the poem "Roly Poly," and the song "Little Green Fly," Up/Down and High/Low concepts are more easily understood when we say or sing AND "act out" the concept. This not only builds vocabulary, but helps children understand meaning in context.

Musically, the octave (8-note scale) in The Bee Song, helps children step up and down the scale in a very fun way - up and down their body! Also, Rimsky-Korsakov's "Flight of the Bumblebee" provides a wonderful introduction to classical music as a backdrop for pretend play - flowers scattered around the room will be visited by children/bees "in flight" collecting nectar! We'll explore the scale on barred instruments, and keep the beat with a wide variety of rhythm instruments!
