Dear Friends in Christ,

Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given us (Romans 12:4-6).

When we give our lives to Christ, God sends the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, to live inside us. One Greek word used by Jesus to describe the Holy Spirit is paraklete, meaning, "one who walks alongside." Besides the gift of eternal life, we also receive another thing (or things!) – we receive spiritual gifts! Each and every Christian has at least one spiritual gift; some have more than one.

During Lent, my messages will look at a variety of spiritual gifts. Reading Scripture, we can count fifteen; some books list as many as twenty-seven. The most important thing is to discern and know what our gift is (or what our gifts are!) Another benefit of knowing your gifts is knowing what our gifts are not! If we are not comfortable with teaching, or administration, or hospitality, that's fine – God has given us another gift for his glory.

Do you know what your gifts are? We will be distributing a spiritual gifts survey in the coming weeks. Hopefully you will have some idea of what God has given you. As Paul says, we are the Body of Christ, and each member can contribute to the work of the Body. You will find a list of gifts elsewhere in the newsletter. Look them over, and see what interests you – perhaps God is speaking!

The first Sunday in Lent is March 1. That Sunday, Greg Nichols (Keith's brother) will preach. He will speak from Acts 17, and will touch on his recent work on the Greek island of Lesvos. Greg's wife Debby will also have some musical offerings.

Lent is the forty days before Easter, a time of reflection and renewal. If you look at a calendar, you will discover there are more than forty days between March 1 and April 12, so how do we get forty days? During Lent, we don't count Sundays – they are days for celebration, recalling the Resurrection of Jesus. Also, the forty days remind us of Jesus' time in the wilderness.

Lent is a season for soul-searching, repentance, and "taking stock." Take a moment each day to pray and reflect on your life, and your life in Christ. Please refer to the Daily Scripture readings elsewhere in the newsletter. As you read, reflect, and pray, ask yourself, "Does my life bring glory to God? Do others see Christ in my thoughts, words, or actions?"

On another matter, continue to pray for your Pastor Nominating Committee – we are ready (and waiting!) for your new pastor to be identified, and to arrive. Please be patient – God knows about our anxiousness. In the meantime, much remains for us to do in the Kingdom. Continue to pray for Mars Church, her leaders, her future, and for the pastor whom God has already chosen to lead our great congregation into the future.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS AND DEFINITIONS

I have listed below a list of spiritual gifts, along with definitions. Some are familiar, some less so. Look them over, to see if any particular gift speaks to you. If you are still unsure, we will be distributing a survey.

ADMINISTRATION: 1 Cor. 12:28 - to steer the body toward the accomplishment of Godgiven goals and directives by planning, organizing, and supervising others (Greek Word: kubernesis - to steer, guide, helmsmen)

<u>APOSTLE:</u> Eph. 4:11; 1 Cor. 12:28 - to be sent forth to new frontiers with the gospel, providing leadership over church bodies and maintaining authority over spiritual matters pertaining to the church (Greek Word: apostolos - 'apo'=from 'stello'=send; one sent forth)

<u>CELIBACY</u>: 1 Cor. 7:7,8 - to voluntarily remain single without regret and with the ability to maintain controlled sexual impulses so as to serve the Lord without distraction

DISCERNMENT: 1 Cor. 12:10 - to clearly distinguish truth from error by judging whether the behavior or teaching is from God, Satan, human error, or human power

EVANGELISM: Eph. 4:11 - to be a messenger of the good news of the Gospel (Greek Word: euaggelistes - preacher of gospel; eu=well, angelos=message - messenger of good)

EXHORTATION: Rom. 12:8 - to come along side of someone with words of encouragement, comfort, consolation, and counsel to help them be all God wants them to be (Greek Word: paraklesis - calling to one's side)

FAITH: 1 Cor. 12:8-10 - to be firmly persuaded of God's power and promises to accomplish His will and purpose and to display such a confidence in Him and His Word that circumstances and obstacles do not shake that conviction

<u>GIVING:</u> Rom. 12:8 - to share what material resources you have with liberality and cheerfulness without thought of return

HEALING: 1 Cor. 12:9,28,30 - to be used as a means through which God makes people whole either physically, emotionally, mentally, or spiritually

HELPS: 1 Cor. 12:28 - to render support or assistance to others in the body so as to free them up for ministry

HOSPITALITY: 1 Pet. 4:9,10 - to warmly welcome people, even strangers, into one's home or church as a means of serving those in need of food or lodging (Greek Word: philoxenos - love of strangers; 'philos'=love; 'xenos'=stranger)

KNOWLEDGE: 1 Cor. 12:8 - to seek to learn as much about the Bible as possible through the gathering of much information and the analyzing of that data

LEADERSHIP: Rom. 12:8 - to stand before the people in such a way as to attend to the direction of the body with such care and diligence so as to motivate others to get involved in the accomplishment of these goals

MARTYRDOM: 1 Cor. 13:3 - to give over one's life to suffer or to be put to death for the cause of Christ

MERCY: Rom. 12:8 - to be sensitive toward those who are suffering, whether physically, mentally, or emotionally, so as to feel genuine sympathy with their misery, speaking words of compassion but moreso caring for them with deeds of love to help alleviate their distress

<u>MIRACLES</u>: 1 Cor. 12:10,28 - to be enabled by God to perform mighty deeds which witnesses acknowledge to be of supernatural origin and means

MISSIONARY: Eph. 3:6-8 - to be able to minister in another culture

PASTOR: Eph. 4:11 - to be responsible for spiritually caring for, protecting, guiding, and feeding a group of believers entrusted to one's care

PROPHECY: Rom. 12:6; 1 Cor. 12:10; Eph. 4:11 - to speak forth the message of God to His people (Greek Word: prophetes - the forth-telling of the will of God; 'pro'=forth; 'phemi'=to speak)

SERVICE: Rom. 12:7 - to identify undone tasks in God's work, however menial, and use available resources to get the job done (Greek Word: diakonia - deacon, attendant 'diako'=to run errands)

TEACHING: Rom. 12:7; 1 Cor. 12:28; Eph. 4:11 - to instruct others in the Bible in a logical, systematic way so as to communicate pertinent information for true understanding and growth

TONGUES: 1 Cor. 12:10; 14:27-28 - to speak in a language not previously learned so unbelievers can hear God's message in their own language or the body be edified

INTERPRETATION OF TONGUES: 1 Cor. 12:10; 14:27,28 - to translate the message of someone who has spoken in tongues

VOLUNTARY POVERTY: 1 Cor. 13:3 - to purposely live an impoverished lifestyle to serve and aid others with your material resources

WISDOM: 1 Cor. 12:8 - to apply knowledge to life in such a way as to make spiritual truths quite relevant and practical in proper decision-making and daily life situations



Building Security: At its February meeting, the Mars Session approved the implementation of some new security measures. Effective March 1, the Social Hall, Second St., and Crowe Ave. doors will be locked at 10:00. The parking lot door will be locked at 10:15. Signs will be posted instructing latecomers to call the church building phone, and a posted volunteer will let them in. This action was taken reluctantly, but your Session feels it is necessary.

Unfortunately, everyone is aware of how society has changed regarding Sunday morning safety. Locking doors during worship is an easy first step, and is more common than one might think. Building & Grounds continues to assess and discuss options regarding security, including weekday activities and the Preschool. Any additional steps will be taken cautiously with everyone's security and convenience in mind.

Ash Wednesday ushered in the liturgical (church) season of Lent on February 26. Lent is a time to revisit, renew, and strengthen our Christian faith as we journey with Jesus Christ towards his execution on the cross. Walking in faith with Christ, we await God's kingdom breaking into the world and our lives. Through Christ—and encouraged by the Holy Spirit—we trust in God's grace and God's promise of resurrection.

Making a Difference

Here are a few ways to make an impact in the community and in our church during Lent:

- Feed the Hungry—each month we collect non-perishable food items to be given to a local food bank. The second Sunday of each month, we take up an additional offering (The Deacon's Kindness Offering) to help support those in financial distress.
- **Chancel Choir** the choir meets for practice Wednesday evenings at 7pm. We have a wonderful choir and are always looking for more people!
- **A-Team** a Tuesday morning group of retirees who do great in and around the church building (*go A-Team*!).
- **Material Girls** a Wednesday morning group who work on a number of crafts including sewing and quilting.
- **Sunday School** classes are available for every age and on a variety of topics. A great way to deepen your faith and get to know other people in the church!
- **Prayer Chain** emails are sent supporting individuals, families, situations in the power of prayer.

Guest Speaker - Greg Nichols

Greater Europe Mission

Sunday, March 1st

Gregory and Debby were married in 1990 with hopes of living in Austria and travelling into Communist countries to mentor pastors through Biblical / theological education by extension. Glasnost and Perestroika allowed their hopes to be exceeded and they became the first missionaries placed into the former Soviet Union with Greater Europe Mission. They moved to Odessa, Ukraine in 1993. For two terms they served at the Odessa Theological Seminary where Greg taught Church History and theology in addition to mentoring students to become pastors through weekly ministry trips. In 2003 they moved to Prague, Czech Republic to work with the International Baptist Theological Seminary. Greg served as a lecturer in the Baptist and Anabaptist Department and as chaplain. Debby uses her musical skills to lead worship and mentors many of the female students. Once he finished his PhD in 2010, Greg was asked to join Greater Europe Mission's leadership team where he serves as the Strategy Leader for North Europe, overseeing several countries. The Nichols family is endeavoring to build up the body of Christ in Europe through multiplying disciples and growing Christ's Church so that God's kingdom is expanded through Europe - to all the world.

We (Greg and Debby) are currently based in Prague, Czech Republic. Greg continues his teaching in several Bible Schools in the former Soviet Union, serves as North Region leader and is the defensive back coach of the Prague Lions. Debby is actively working with the refugee families that have settled into Prague helping them find shelter, clothing, food and education.
