The Timing of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ

The correct sequence and chronology of the death and resurrection of the Messiah are outlined in this document. The facts are based entirely upon the Biblical texts. The keys are:

1) The sign (of Jonah) Jesus gave proving he is the Son of God. 2) How God counts days. 3) The timing of Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread as it fell during the week of Christ's death and resurrection. 4) The texts involving the women preparing burial spices before the Sabbath but purchasing them after the Sabbath (Mk. 16:1 & Lk. 23:54-56).

5) Two disciples walking to Emmaus not knowing Christ had risen, are saddened because it was the first day of the week - the day following the fulfillment of the sign of Jonah.

Description of Daily Events

3	Tuesday	During the afternoon and evening the young men prepare for the Passover Festival. After dark on the 14 th of Nissan (Abib), Jesus and his disciples partake in				
		the Lord's Supper. Later that night Jesus is betrayed and arrested.				
4	Wednesday	Jesus is nailed to a tree (stake) at the same time the Passover lambs begin to be slaughtered in the Temple. Jesus dies and is removed for burial just before				
		dark, at which time the 1 st day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread begins and the Passover meal is eaten. This is an annual "High Day" or Sabbath.				
5	Thursday	At dark, the 1 st Day of Unleavened Bread ends.				
6	Friday	The women buy the spices the day after the annual Sabbath (1 st Day-ULB), on the preparation day, and prepare them before the weekly Sabbath.				
7	Saturday	Just before dark, exactly three days and three nights after Jesus internment, he is resurrected to life by his God and Father.				
1	Sunday	Before sunrise "as it was yet dark" the women with spices find the tomb empty. Two disciples are unaware of the news and are saddened Christ had not risen				
		as Sunday was the day following the third day since all these things occurred – which proves Easter is false (Lk. 24:21; RNT, cf. Nestle-Aland GNT, 27 th Ed.).
