# **Board Chairman's Report**

First of all I would like to welcome the new Board and Committee Member (see below). All new members are noted in red. In all positions we have some new members that will be bringing fresh ideas that will help move the Camp forward. **Welcome aboard all**. I look forward to the new year where we all work together in **GROWING THE CAMP**. We have three significant events coming up.:

- 1. July 23 Lions Day Board meeting at 3:00
- 2. Oct. 22 our first Board Meeting in Perry
- 3. Nov. 5 Camp Long Range Planning Retreat

To the Lions of Georgia I thank you for all your support in serving and funding the Camp for this past year. Without you there would be no Georgia Lions Camp for the visual impaired citizens of Georgia. **Thank you.** Last summer we had 28 campers all summer. This year we have 58 registered. Last year we had to cancel the 6-12 year old session because we only had two registered. This year we had six with four being first timers. I would like to thank each of the Lions that took the time to contact their school district to spread the word about our Camp. Also I would like to thank all the Lion Clubs and individual Lions and non-Lions that contributed to the Camp this past Lion's Year; we did not have to withdraw any funds from our Investment Fund.

However, In May and June the Camp has had a string of bad luck. We have had lightning strikes that have caused equipment damage and several pieces of equipment failed: Fire alarm systems, all the internet systems, two HVAC units, two refrigerators, and the pool pump. We are hoping most of these items will be covered by our insurance. We need to encourage all of our Lions Clubs to continue their contributions for the second half of this calendar year.

My motto last year was **SERVING THE CAMP MORE**. I believe we, the **Lions of Georgia**, fulfilled the motto. We provided the funding to keep the Camp in the black, we got more campers to come back. The Camp's committees worked hard in accomplishing their objectives. The Constitution Committee rewrote the Constitution, created the new

Bylaws and got both approved. The Fund Raising Committee along with some of the district Clubs held several fundraisers and work is well underway to receive several grants. The Long Range Planning Committee has begun to rewrite the Camp's Long Range Plan and has a work retreat scheduled for Nov. 4-6. The Trustees revised procedures on how to utilize the Investment Fund. So I am proud to say that the Board, its committees and the Lions of Georgia put the effort in to **SERVING THE CAMP MORE**, this past year. And of course I must say that our Camp Director, Mike Williams and our Office Manager, Gail Williams, definitely **SERVED THE CAMP MORE** in getting the Camp back into business with campers, facing all the "challenges" that occur daily and working the extra hours to get the JOB DONE. As Chairman of the Board of Director I say THANK YOU ALL.

Now we are entering a new Lions Year and my motto for the Camp this year is to **GROW THE CAMP MORE**. How can you, a Georgia Lion, can help **GROW THE CAMP MORE**? There are numerous ways you can do that:

- 1. Grow the number of campers by contacting your local schools and inform them of our Camp.
- 2. Volunteer on the numerous fundraisers at the Camp, in your district, or by your Club.
- 3. Volunteer to come work at the Camp. There are always many projects to be completed.

- 5. Make individual donations to the Camp
- 6. Next year, volunteer to come on the Board of Directors or one of its committees.

District 18-I again remains on top with the district having the highest number of their Clubs making contributions to the Camp for the year (35 Clubs for 65%). And 18-N remains on top with the most dollars contributed to the Camp for \$34,462.

#### Camp Finances Y-T-D thru JUNE 30, 2022

Last month, when I reported on the Camp's Finances thru the Month of May, I reported that "...The GA Lions Camp ALMOST REACHED OUR GOAL of 3.5 Months of Cash-on-Hand."

Things have changed -- Camping Season started during June, so expenses ALWAYS go up (that is our reason for being, so it is expected). However, our level of contributions needs to go up at the same time, it did not -- it went down for the Month of June.

Our actual Revenue for June was \$11,150.11 --- our actual Expenses were \$33,580.87. You can do the math.

July is a Camping Season month also, expenses will be high again -- so, obviously, the Camp needs your financial support. # Needs List 2022: updated 7/12/22

The following items will help the daily operations of the camp. Many have asked what does the camp need?

- 1. Gallon size bleach- Five cases of 6 bottles per case
- 2. Toilet bowl cleaner- 2 cases of 12? bottles per case
- 3. Lysol dis-infectant spray- 2 cases of 6? cans per case
- 4. Spray cans of room deodorizer- 30 cans of spray
- 5. Laundry detergent- gallon size preferable- 3 cases of 6? Bottles per case
- 6. Dish detergent (dawn preferred)-Large size- 30 bottles needed
- 7. Windex window cleaner- 2 cases of 6 per case
- 8. Clorox disinfectant spray bottles 2 cases of 6 per case-(32 oz.)
- 9. Orange Multi surface cleaner 2 case of 6 per case- (32 oz.)
- 10. Pumie stone sticks for toilet bowl cleaning- as many as possible- 2 cases of 24 per case
- 11. Dish towels for the kitchen
- 12. Toilet Tissue any brand
- 13. Toilet Bowl Plungers and Brushes Need 8 sets
- 14. Paper towels any brand 8 cases
- 15. Clorox wipes- large size 12
- 16. Baby wipes- individual packages 12
- 17.60-gallon industrial size garbage bags

18. Zip Lock storage bags, 12 boxes/ half gallon – 48 boxes/ one gallon, 12 boxes-quart size, a question was asked, do these need to be the zip lock brand? Zip Lock works best for what we need at camp.

- 19. Food serving gloves- case of/one size fits all Powder Free
- 20. Bug spray- non- DEET and DEET accepted. -24 cans spray or pump
- 21. Sunscreen <u>Spray</u> -at least 50/75 spf non allergenic -24 cans-spray or pump
- 22. Disposable ponchos for rainy days 100 these can be found at dollar stores or dollar general
- 23. Small bottles of hand sanitizer- This item has been provided by the Lyons Lions Club
- 24. Small first aid kits- 24 sets of travel size
- 25. Band-Aids all sizes 12 packages
- 26. Bandage wraps 24 packages of 3 per package
- 27. Gauze rolls or square- 48 pieces
- 28. Wasp Spray- Black Flag brand preferred. 2 cases of 12 per case.

29. Ant poison- here at the camp we have ant issues, we need your help- bags of poison or industrial strength liquid needed. You can never ask for enough of this. All donations appreciated.

- 30. 50-1 mix for weed eaters and lawn maintenance tools used here at the camp. 24 bottles
- 31. 5W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qts. Per case
- 32. 10W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qts per case
- 33.1 five gallon of Hydraulic Fluid for the tractor

All of the above items listed are used all through the year as needed.

Gift Cards are a great way for the camp to purchase other items that may not be on this list. (Movies, Board games, and other items for campers)

Items purchased can be shipped directly to the camp, (**5626 Laura Walker Rd. Waycross, Ga. 31503**) taken and distributed during the annual MD-18 Lions State Convention, brought on Lions Day here at the camp, or when you come to work weekends.

#### October 21-23, 2022 is our next scheduled Service Days:

# (You don't have to wait until a scheduled Service Day to come work at the camp) (Please know that you can call and schedule a workday anytime the camp does not have an event going on)

1. Weed pulling, edging, raking, wheel barrow use, and sanitation are many other jobs to be done during this work session. BRING your gloves and definitely some BUG SPRAY!!

2. Repair the Whale Watch element at the Low Ropes Course

3. Climbing Wall due for pressure washing and wood treatment (Man lift will need to be rented to accomplish this task) Other minor maintenance can be done during this activity)

4. Wooden picnic tables need replacing. Repairs would cost as much as new tables.

5. Nature Trail –build up low lying areas we continue to need Two loads of crushed asphalt and Two loads of fill dirt.

- 6. Paint water heater room located behind the newly renovated Staff Building.
- 7. Paint the Water Tank
- 8. Paint the pump house at the pond
- 9. Paint sidewalks at the exit doors to the bunkhouse.
- 10. Repair Emergency exit door at restrooms in the Dining Hall.
- 14. Clean and paint swing frames at the fire pit area.
- 15. Sitting Swings at the fire pit need to be cleaned and painted.
- 16. Activity Site Warning signs have been replaced and repaired but framing needs cleaning and painting.
- 17. Repaint Dining Hall.
- 18. Lights in Large Dormitory and Bunkhouse Dormitory still need to be converted to LED bulbs.
- 19. Pull out canoes and see which ones need repairing
- 20. Repair broken board on canoe cart
- 21. Tin roof over bleachers at horse arena needs to be re-applied
- 22. Pressure wash poolside deck
- 23. Sign up for lawn care maintenance (mowing weed eating, trimming, etc.)
- 24. Fence repair (several post and rails have decayed and broken)
