Wayne and Kathy are lifetime LGMC members, having joined the club 20 years ago. Mineral of the Month report

Apophyllite by Astrid

Apophyllite is a hydrated potassium calcium silicate mineral that crystallizes in the form of a pyramid and cubic crystals. The most common color is clear or white. Other colors are gray, yellow, red, or green. However, green apophyllite is the rarest color. On the Mohs scale, apophyllite is 4.5 to 5. It can be found all over the world. The biggest ones come from volcanic rocks in places like India, Germany, and Canada. The year it was discovered was 1957. When heated, it can flake apart. It does this because it releases water molecules. This is where it gets its name, apophyllite.*

(Pauline's note: the Greek word apophyllizo means "it flakes off.")
