MINUTES March 20, 2013

Chairman Chamberlain called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

Ms. Napolitani recapped the correspondence:

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Houck reviewed the monthly financial report and determined that nothing was out-of-line.

In reference to correspondence #8, Mr. Houck gave a synopsis on how the estimated flow from the Augustinian Recollect Center was first established. Since there was no historical data available, flow was based on a worst-case scenario with the Center operating at full capacity for its potential use utilizing State standards. They were required to install a cycle counter (meter) when they connected to the sewer system in 2012, but did not read the meter until recently, so, no flow information was available. Therefore, when the FY2013 budget was prepared, projected flow was based again on DEP criteria for the Center's potential use. Their engineer submitted flow information to us on or about March 12, 2013. The Sisters are not using the facility to its full capacity and are seeking a reduction in projected flow and sewer charges based on this new information. After reviewing this information, Mr. Houck determined the estimated flow was high by a factor of about ten. He asked for direction from the Board and noted that a similar situation may arise with the county for the recent connection of its new buildings located on Route 519 in White Township.

Mr. Niece remarked that State standard numbers are usually high, while actual flows are usually less. He remembers a similar situation when Brookfield connected to our system.

After further discussion, Mr. Scott moved to reduce their flow estimate by half, contingent upon the Authority being able to inspect their cycle meter quarterly. After more discussion, Mr. Scott amended his motion to reduce their estimate to three EDUs, contingent upon the Authority being able to inspect/monitor their cycle meter quarterly. Mr. Niece seconded. The motion passed, roll call was as follows:

The Authority bills White Township for sewer treatment charges, and then White Township bills the Center. The annual letter and first quarter bill for 2013 was sent to White in January, so White will have to be informed of the Board's decision. Mr. Houck will prepare a letter to be sent to White Township. This change applies to 2013 billing only, retroactive to January 1, 2013.

Mr. Houck left the meeting.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Tipton's office submitted all supporting documents necessary to award the legal services contract. The rate and terms are the same as the previous year.

Mr. Niece asked Mr. Tipton if there were any conflict of interest issues due to his business relationships with White Township, PCFA and perhaps the county. If so, how is the matter handled?

Mr. Tipton stated that whenever a conflict issue arose, he or someone else brought the matter to everyone's attention. Since he started representing the MUA, the issue has only happened once or twice. He did not participate in the discussion, and in one matter, Mr. Wauhop negotiated the settlement. If a conflict does exist and legal counsel is necessary, special counsel will need to be hired.

Mr. Scott moved to adopt Resolution #13-15, awarding a non-fair and open contract for professional services with Florio Perrucci Steinhardt & Fader for legal services from March 20, 2013 to February 19, 2014 at a rate of \$145.00 per hour. Mr. Piazza seconded. The motion passed, roll call was as follows:

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Belstra property: Nothing new to report.

Augustinian Recollect Center: Already discussed.

CPE performed a laboratory-testing audit, and completed and submitted the annual DRBC Effluent Monitoring Report.

Oxford Upgrade Design: The redesign for the VES changes is ongoing.

Just prior to tonight's regular meeting, the Upgrade committee met with Mr. Donati and Mr. Wauhop to review its status.

Upgrade Permitting: The Treatment Works Approval (TWA) has to be modified and should be submitted within the next couple of weeks. Local permits should be submitted by the middle to late April.

Upgrade Financing: Plans and specs must be submitted to the Trust by April 1, 2013.

Manhole Inspections: CPE completed inspections of the manholes. A report will be forthcoming.

White Township FWSA: Regarding correspondence #3, Mr. Donati displayed maps showing the existing sewer service areas (SSA) and the White Township Future Wastewater Service Area (FWSA). Some areas that are in the current SSA have been removed from the FWSA. This is not White Township's fault and is due to new DEP regulations. The Authority has been asked to endorse the FWSA by White Township as an interested party.

Mr. Rosenberg asked why the Authority would endorse something that would be unfavorable to the Authority. Several commissioners pointed out that our plants are not at full capacity.

Mr. Tipton explained White Township's position and struggles with the DEP, particularly with the environmental issues with the septic systems along Route 46. He believes that the FWSA was the best White Township could negotiate with the DEP.

Mr. Niece acknowledged White's effort, but felt the Authority would be doing everybody a disservice if the Board supports the FWSA. With no disrespect to White Township, he felt the Authority should protest against it because DEP rules make no sense.

Mr. Donati said there is a comment period, which may end before the next regular meeting.

Chairman Chamberlain directed Mr. Donati to use the past letter sent to the DEP as a template to protest the matter, stressing the environmental issues and hardship to our current users.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report. He recapped the list of some of the maintenance items performed in-house within the last month. Since Mr. Codis has been put in charge of maintenance at both plants, the operators give Mr. Wauhop work reports on any maintenance work they perform.

Under general business, some quotes have been received for the proposed new pump station at Axford Avenue.

Improving the sludge thickening process at the Belvidere plant, to reduce costs, is still being examined. Mr. Wauhop plans to have a meeting with CP Engineers about utilizing existing equipment to increase sludge thickening capacity.

The operators will be removing the old ragbag collector that is used in the anoxic tank and installing it in the Belvidere grease trap to collect debris coming from the County line.

Mr. Wauhop will be looking at other sand-filters in the area to confirm that we are operating ours correctly.

He reported on TDS. There is excellent communication between PCFA staff and our staff.

Laboratory Analysis Contract: QC Labs submitted their supporting documents on time.

Chairman Chamberlain presented the resolution and agreement authorizing the award of a non-fair and open contract for professional services for laboratory testing to QC Labs, Inc.

Ms. Napolitani moved to adopt Resolution #13-16, awarding the non-fair and open contract for the professional services of laboratory testing to QC Labs, Inc. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Regarding the chemical contract that was awarded in January, Mr. Wauhop contacted Univar to inquire about bulk tanks being installed at the Oxford plant for caustic soda and aluminum chloride. The chemicals would be safer for our operators to handle and are the same price. There is a one-year contract to provide the bulk tank for the caustic soda. Chairman Chamberlain signed the one-year contract for the tank to hold caustic soda. The contract for the bulk tank for aluminum chloride is for two-years, so we cannot enter into this contract at this time.

FINANCE (TREASURER)

As mentioned earlier by Mr. Houck, there were no red flags noted in the financial reports.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #13-17 (Certificate No. 320: \$99,571.10) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund (correcting a typo on a voucher). Mr. Rosenberg seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #13-18 (Certificate No. 328: \$62,854.66) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund. Ms. O'Connor seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. Kiszonak inquired about the status of an earlier request from a bicycle club. Mr. Wauhop said he would call them to see if they are still interested.

NEW BUSINESS

None.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

There was no executive session.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Niece moved and Mr. Piazza seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:37 p.m.?

WHEREAS, the firm has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that it has not made any unauthorized reportable contributions to a an unauthorized recipient in the previous one year, and the Contractor will be prohibited from making any contribution in contravention of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 through the term of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, there are funds available for this Contract.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

RESOLUTION: 13-16 AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF A NON-FAIR AND OPEN CONTRACT FOR LABORATORY SERVICES

WHEREAS, there exists a need for Certified laboratory testing services to the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority, (hereinafter the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority's Chairman has determined and certified in writing that the value of the contract will exceed or is reasonably likely to exceed \$17,500; and
