In his book, <u>Good to Great</u>, Jim Collins emphasizes that a crucial element in building a great organization is "getting the right people on the bus." The Friends of Governor Dodge Equestrians are a shining example of how engaging the right people for your group can make great things happen.

The Governor Dodge State Park Master Plan adopted in 1984 called for a horse campground on the north side of the park. For over 20 years managers included the campground on the park's annual project list submitted to the DNR for approval and funding. Surveys documented the deficiencies of the "temporary" campground. Users sporadically prodded the DNR asking, "When are you going to build us a real campground?" Yet, until 2014, the project languished.

Diverse Friends Guide Governor Dodge Equestrian Projects

What was the magic ingredient that finally got things moving on the horse campground? The answer is simple. A group of amazing and determined women from the Janesville area, acquainted through membership in an area horse club, decided that it was time to act. They joined Governor Dodge State Park's existing 501 (c) 3 Friends group, forming the Friends of Governor Dodge Equestrian committee, and got to work.

Since 2014, the Governor Dodge Equestrians worked with the DNR to develop campground concept design plans, sought user input in selecting a plan, and whittled down the budget to a more manageable \$600,000 from earlier estimates that exceeded \$2 million. The group sought and received written assurance that at least 12 of 21 proposed sites will be electric. And since launching fundraising in June of 2018, they have raised \$255,000! Best of all, they had fun doing it.

Along with Friends from Dodgeville and nearby communities, the Governor Dodge equestrian committee includes members from much further away including Eagle, Janesville, Marshall, Whitewater and Verona. Members contribute in a multitude of ways, utilizing an array of talents to plan fun events, increase community awareness of all that Governor Dodge State Park has to offer, and of course to raise funds for the horse campground project.

Answering the question of what motivates this diverse group to volunteer their time and talents (over 3,200 hours in 2019 alone) would take another article. Love of horses, love of Governor Dodge State Park, understanding the unique role of parks as a link to the natural world, and the satisfaction of making a lasting contribution to future generations all play a role. But for many, the best part of volunteering is the experience of being "on the bus" with a group of enthusiastic, creative and dedicated horse lovers.
