Deputy Administrator Dana Coale of the United States Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service Dairy Program expects most if not all PMVAP payments to be made to dairy producers by the end of February. The PMVAP payments are paid by USDA to milk handlers, who will then have 30

days to distribute the payments to dairy producers.


USDA anticipates that eligible dairy farmers will receive <u>PMVAP</u> payments during January and February 2022.

Through the Pandemic Market Volatility Assistance Program, USDA will provide more than \$350 million in pandemic assistance payments to dairy farmers who received a lower value due to market abnormalities caused by the pandemic and ensuing Federal policies.

- Payments will reimburse qualified dairy farmers for 80 percent of the revenue difference per month based on an annual production of up to 5 million pounds of milk marketed and on fluid milk sales from July through December 2020.
- USDA will make payments through agreements with independent handlers and cooperatives. Handlers and cooperatives will distribute the monies on the same basis July - December 2020 payments were made to their dairy farmer suppliers. USDA will reimburse handlers

- and cooperatives for allowed administrative costs.
- USDA contacted eligible handlers and cooperatives to notify them of the opportunity to participate in the program and will distribute payments to participating handlers within 60 days of entering into an agreement.
- Once payment is received, a handler will have 30 days to distribute monies to qualifying dairy farmers. Handlers will also be reimbursed for limited administrative and educational costs.
- As part of the program, handlers also will provide virtual or in-person education to dairy farmers on the program and other dairy topics, selecting from educational information available from USDA or other sources. A handler will have until March 1, 2022, to provide educational opportunities to dairy farmers.

California Dairy Campaign just completed our December dairy producer milk pricing survey. The survey provides detailed information about milk pricing each month, monthly price comparisons, and ranks milk handlers based on prices paid to dairy producers since the beginning of the year.

Dairy producers provide just four numbers:
Fat percentage
Protein Percentage
Other Solids Percentage
Gross Milk Price

Dairy producers have been utilizing the reports to discuss milk pricing with their milk handlers, as well as comparing dairy pricing information with dairy producers in California and around the country. The monthly milk pricing survey ranks each milk handler based on prices paid each month and is a valuable tool for dairy producers to have to determine how their milk price compares to prices paid across the state each month.

Healthy Soils Program (HSP)



Sign-up for the Healthy Soils Program (HSP) is happening now, and California Dairy Campaign and California Farmers Union are working with farmers on their HSP applications. The deadline is February 25, 2022.

The <u>HSP Incentives Program</u> provides financial assistance for the implementation of conservation management that improves soil health, sequesters carbon, and reduces greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. A list of HSP practices is available on the CDFA website and linked here.

Which specific soil management practices are eligible for funding? On-farm management practices that include but are not limited to: cover cropping, no-till, reduced-till, mulching, compost application, and conservation plantings.

Alternative Manure Management Program

What is an alternative manure management practice?

Alternative manure management practices involve handling manure in ways that don't involve using an anaerobic digester. Currently, eligible practices for funding through AMMP include: pasture-based based management; solid separation or conversion from flush to scrape in conjunction with some form of drying or composting of collected manure.
