May Lunch Summary

The May 2011 SAABE luncheon presentation was given by Brenda Berger with Entech Sales and Service. The topic was "The Future of Building Automation - Systems Integration." Below is a recap of the presentation.

Automation is the process of integrating systems such as HVAC control, environmental monitoring and control, access control, closed circuit television (CCTV), digital video recording systems, elevator control, parking lot supervision, fire alarm monitoring and other building systems into one network.

What Can a Building Automation System Do for Me?

- Building Automation systems provide operators a central location to receive building alarms and operating conditions. By utilizing local area networks or wide area networks, multiple workstations can be incorporated.
- Remote alarming is available through networks and phone modems.

- An automation system can provide scheduling and tracking of after hours building use to ensure tenant comfort and allow operating costs to be assessed to the appropriate cost center.
- Abnormal operating conditions can often be detected and corrected before tenant comfort or safety is compromised.
- Mechanical systems can be monitored and preventative maintenance scheduled on run time or other user defined variables.
- Digital control systems provide precise control of environmental conditions as well as operating schedules for mechanical equipment. This equates to dollar savings through reduced energy consumption.



The metal thieves have a new target at our places of business—the caps, adapters, and nozzles related to fire sprinklers, standpipes, fire hose stations, etc. They are stealing the brass adapters and caps on the fire sprinkler risers/standpipes in the stairwells.

An adapter and cap can cost \$70/pair, times two per floor, times how many floors. The fog nozzles on the end of the hoses can be upwards of \$160/each.

He has replaced the T-8s in the hallways and front and rear entrances with 25 watt bulbs and will do so wherever possible. The boiler is a single pass hydronic design, and all motors have VFDs.


Items planned for the future to conserve energy and water
