"I've always thought it a privilege to serve the Seniors of Pickaway County. Many of those we serve can no longer drive, and the Center provides vital services for them, one of which is transportation," says Stuart Sharpnack.

In his time as Coordinator, for over 25 years, he's seen a great deal of change in our county, and those the Center serves, but the need for support has always been part of life, that hasn't changed.

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging's Volunteer Guardian Program

Volunteer Guardians are substitute decision-makers for people who are unable to make informed personal decisions in their own best interest. Guardians do many things to ensure the quality of life for those they serve, making informed decisions about medical care and living environments; also little, thoughtful things.

Not Everyone Has Someone

Not everyone has family or friends willing to be responsible for decision making. In Central Ohio, there are a growing number of adults who have lost the ability to make reasoned decisions and are without anyone to assist them. In some cases, volunteers who are trained and supported by professionals can help.

The Volunteer Guardian Program (VGP) at the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging recruits, screens, trains and supports people to be court-appointed "Guardians of the Person." These guardians make medical and quality of life decisions for individuals who have no one willing to assist them; Volunteer Guardians do not handle money or have financial responsibility.

People served by VGP are adults who live in nursing homes or other group-care settings and have some type of mental impairment. Whatever the reason, their ability to process information has deteriorated; they are alone and they need help.

Volunteer Requirements:

- Volunteers must be at least 21 years of age
- · Have reliable transportation
- Provide five personal or professional references
- · Attend an interview
- Undergo a background check
- Complete training

Training and Matching Process:

The time between a volunteer applying to the program and a legal appointment can take several months. During this time, Volunteers:

- Attend an interview with program staff and have fingerprints taken
- · Attend pre-service training that prepares them for the role
- Describe the type of person for whom they would like to serve as guardian, ie, what level of physical or communication limitations the person may have

When someone who needs a guardian fits within the volunteer's goals, a meeting is suggested. Once the volunteer meets and accepts the match, an application for guardianship is filed with county probate court, approximately six weeks from filing; VGP case managers are with the volunteer throughout the process.

Guardian Responsibilities

After properly matched the volunteer will:

- Attend a brief hearing at Probate Court w/VGP
- Develop a nurturing relationship with the person by visiting twice a month
- Participate in care planning, giving consent for medical treatment and other services
- · Enhance the quality of life by visiting

Volunteer Support and Technical Assistance

To assist the volunteer, we offer:

- A 6-hour training to prepare them for the role
- On-going support, training, technical assistance from VGP staff
- Free continuing education opportunities and support

Serving as Volunteer Guardian may seem like a huge responsibility, but those who have served say it is the opportunity of a lifetime. Benefits include:

- Knowledge of nursing homes, medical procedures, hospitals and hospice.
- Interaction with a variety of professionals including doctors, nurses, therapists, and social workers.
- The satisfaction of enhancing the quality of life of another human being.




